WHEREAS, COPD is considered to be the second leading
 cause of disability in the nation; and

3 WHEREAS, the annual cost to the nation in 2010 is
4 estimated to be \$49.9 billion; and

5 WHEREAS, increased public awareness, early detection 6 and treatment are crucial in the prevention or slowing the 7 progression of lung disease and can lead to reduced costs and 8 better quality of life for our residents; now therefore,
