ARNOLD HORNBUCKLE. 8 9 WHEREAS, with profound sorrow and regret, we receive 10 news of the death of Mr. Arnold Hornbuckle of Huntsville, 11 12 Alabama, on January 31, 2012, at the age of 84 years; and 13 WHEREAS, the passing of Mr. Hornbuckle leaves a void 14 in the lives of his loving family, his many friends, and the 15 entire community, where he was highly regarded as a broadcasting pioneer, business entrepreneur, and civic leader; 16 17 and WHEREAS, born on March 18, 1927, in Huntsville, he 18 was the son of Weston Neal and Lillie Mae Hornbuckle; as a 19 20 teenager, he developed an interest in music that eventually 21 led to the opening of his first retail business, Hornbuckle's 22 Record Shop, an enterprise that quickly expanded to include 23 musical instruments and home entertainment electronics; and 24 WHEREAS, in 1959, he founded WAHR-FM radio station, 25 the first FM station in Alabama that was not previously associated with an existing AM radio station, and over a 26 27 40-year period, his broadcast facility became one of the

consistently highest rated stations in North Alabama; in
addition, his retail businesses continued to expand over the
years; in 2009, he was inducted into the Alabama Broadcasters
Association Hall of Fame; and

WHEREAS, his roles of community leadership included 5 being a founding member of the Space City Lions Club and 6 7 dedicated service on the boards of the YMCA, Chamber of Commerce, United Way, Boys and Girls Club, Huntsville 8 Rehabilitation Foundation, Burritt Museum, and Better Business 9 10 Bureau; he was a member of the First Baptist church in 11 Huntsville and was very active with the Mended Hearts 12 organization; and

WHEREAS, survivors include two sons, Ronnie Hornbuckle and Guy Hornbuckle, and one brother, Austin Hornbuckle; in addition to his parents, he was predeceased by a brother, Murlen Hornbuckle; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hornbuckle was a valued member of the community; although his presence will be greatly missed, his memory will be cherished in the hearts and minds of those who were fortunate to know him; now therefore,
