WHEREAS, Mr. Minter utilizes lumber, dolls, lawn ornaments, doors, and other found materials that he shapes, paints, assembles, and writes messages on; his primary themes involve African-American history, especially in Birmingham, including installations that memorialize the 1963 church bombing and the Birmingham City Jail experience of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.; and

WHEREAS, included in the exhibits are representations of the spirits of African warriors looking over their descendants, along with depictions of the achievements of African-Americans in numerous fields, and there are constant Biblical references, words of praise, hope, and thanksgiving to God; and
