1 SB107

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4 ENROLLED, An Act,

5 Relating to the Alabama Sunset Law; to continue the  
6 existence and functioning of the Alabama Electronic Security  
7 Board of Licensure with certain modifications; to amend  
8 Section 34-1A-5, Code of Alabama 1975, so as to authorize the  
9 board to provide for the staggering of licenses.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

11 Section 1. Pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law, the  
12 Sunset Committee recommends the continuance of the Alabama  
13 Electronic Security Board of Licensure until October 1, 2016,  
14 with the additional recommendation for statutory change as set  
15 out in Section 3.

16 Section 2. The existence and functioning of the  
17 Alabama Electronic Security Board of Licensure, created and  
18 functioning pursuant to Sections 34-1A-1 to 34-1A-11,  
19 inclusive, Code of Alabama 1975, is continued until October 1,  
20 2016, and those code sections are expressly preserved.

21 Section 3. Section 34-1A-5 of the Code of Alabama  
22 1975, is amended to read as follows:

23 "§34-1A-5.

1           "(a) The board shall issue licenses authorized by  
2 this chapter to all qualified individuals in accordance with  
3 rules or regulations established by the board.

4           "(b) The annual license fee as set by the board  
5 shall not exceed one hundred fifty dollars (\$150) for an  
6 individual and seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750) for a  
7 business entity.

8           "(c) The license shall not be transferred or  
9 assigned and is valid only with respect to the person to whom  
10 it is issued.

11           "(d) (1) No license shall be granted if the applicant  
12 has had any prior business license revoked for fraud,  
13 misrepresentation, or any other act that would constitute a  
14 violation of this chapter.

15           "(2)a. An applicant shall not be refused a license  
16 solely because of a prior criminal conviction, unless the  
17 criminal conviction directly relates to the occupation or  
18 profession for which the license is sought. The board may  
19 refuse a license if, based on all the information available,  
20 including the applicant's record of prior convictions, the  
21 board finds that the applicant is unfit or unsuited to engage  
22 in the business.

23           "b. The board may consult with appropriate state or  
24 federal law enforcement authorities to verify whether an  
25 applicant has a criminal record prior to granting any license

1 and, as an aid to this duty, each applicant may be required to  
2 provide his or her fingerprints and complete an affidavit of  
3 his or her criminal record, if any, as a part of the  
4 application. The board may periodically consult with state and  
5 federal law enforcement officials to determine whether current  
6 licensees have new criminal convictions.

7 "(e) Any license granted pursuant to this chapter  
8 shall expire on a schedule established by rule of the board,  
9 unless it is renewed pursuant to regulations established by  
10 the board or unless it is suspended or revoked.

11 "(f) An affirmative vote of a majority of board  
12 members shall be required before any action to suspend or  
13 revoke a license, to impose a sanction on a licensee, or to  
14 levy a monetary penalty. A board member shall disqualify  
15 himself or herself and withdraw from any case in which he or  
16 she cannot accord fair and impartial consideration.

17 "(g) A nonresident of this state may be licensed by  
18 meeting one of the following requirements:

19 "(1) Conforming to the provisions of this chapter  
20 and the regulations of the board.

21 "(2) Holding a valid license in another state with  
22 which reciprocity has been established by the board.

23 "(h) A licensee shall display the license at its  
24 normal place of business and in a manner easily readable by  
25 the general public.

1           "(i) A notice shall be displayed prominently in the  
2 place of business of each licensee regulated pursuant to this  
3 chapter containing the name, mailing address, and telephone  
4 number of the board, and a statement informing consumers that  
5 complaints against licensees may be directed to the board.

6           "(j) The license number of a licensee shall be  
7 displayed in all advertising.

8           "(k) The board shall prepare information of consumer  
9 interest describing the regulatory functions and describing  
10 the procedures of the board by which consumer complaints shall  
11 be filed with and resolved by the board. The board shall make  
12 the information available to the general public and  
13 appropriate state agencies. The board shall provide upon  
14 request a listing of all licensees. The board may collect a  
15 fee for the cost of duplicating and mailing materials.

16           "(l) Each written contract for services in the state  
17 of a licensee shall contain the name, mailing address, and  
18 telephone number of the board and a statement informing  
19 consumers that complaints against licensees may be directed to  
20 the board.

21           "(m) Notice of the issuance, revocation,  
22 reinstatement, or expiration of every license issued by the  
23 board shall be furnished to the sheriff of the county and the  
24 chief of police, as appropriate, and the inspection department

1 of the city where the principal place of business of a  
2 licensee is located.

3 "(n) Information contained in alarm system records  
4 held by the board concerning the location of an alarm system,  
5 the name of the occupant residing at the alarm system  
6 location, or the type of alarm system used shall be  
7 confidential and disclosed only to the board or as otherwise  
8 required by law."

9 Section 4. The Legislature concurs in the  
10 recommendations of the Sunset Committee as provided in  
11 Sections 1, 2, and 3.

12 Section 5. This act shall become effective  
13 immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or  
14 its otherwise becoming law.
