commission; and to establish a Joint Legislative Oversight
Committee of the Alabama Firefighters' Personnel Standards and
Education Commission.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Sections 36-32-1, 36-32-2, 36-32-3, and 36-32-5 of the Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

12 "\$36-32-1.

"For the purpose of this chapter, the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings, respectively, unless the context clearly indicates the contrary:

"(1) FUND. The Alabama Firefighters' Personnel
Standards and Education Fund provided for in Section 36-32-9.

ALABAMA FIRE COLLEGE. The independent public institution of postsecondary education established by this chapter and operated under the general control and supervision of the Alabama Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education

Commission for the purposes of educating, training, and certifying firefighters and trainees in fire prevention and suppression, emergency medical services, and related fields.

All assets owned by the Alabama Fire College and the Alabama Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education Commission,

1	upon passage of the act amending this section, shall remain
2	the property of the state and shall be titled in the name of
3	the Alabama Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education
4	Commission.
5	"(2) COMMISSION. The Alabama Firefighters' Personnel
6	Standards and Education Commission established by this
7	chapter.
8	"(3) COMMITTEE. The Joint Legislative Oversight
9	Committee of the Alabama Firefighters' Personnel Standards and
10	Education Commission established by this chapter.
11	" $\frac{(3)}{(4)}$ FIRE-FIGHTING AGENCY. Any agency charged
12	with the responsibility of detecting, combating, and
13	preventing damage to property and lives by fires, but
14	excluding the Alabama State Forestry Commission.
15	" $\frac{(4)}{(5)}$ FIRE PROTECTION PERSONNEL and FIREFIGHTER.
16	Any person permanently employed in fire administration, fire
17	prevention, fire suppression, fire education, arson
18	investigation, and emergency medical services, but excluding
19	employees of the Alabama State Forestry Commission.
20	" (5) (6) VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTER. Any person who is not
21	permanently employed as fire protection personnel or
22	firefighter but who otherwise engages in fire administration,
23	fire prevention, fire suppression, fire education, arson
24	investigation, and emergency medical services.
25	" $\frac{(6)}{(7)}$ TRAINEE. A firefighter who has not been
26	certified by the commission as having met the minimum basic

training as set forth by Section 36-32-7 and by the rules and regulations adopted by the commission.

"(7)(8) SCHOOL. Any school located within the State of Alabama whether privately or publicly owned which offers a course in fire protection training or related subjects and which has been approved by the commission.

"(8)(9) STATE. The State of Alabama.

"The Alabama Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education Commission/Alabama State Fire College-Shelton State Community College is hereby created and established. The commission shall consist of seven members, each of whom must shall be a qualified elector of the state who is over the age of 18 years. The Professional Firefighters Association of Alabama shall designate nominate one member of the commission certified firefighter to serve for a term of four years; the Alabama Firemen's Firefighter's Association shall designate nominate one member certified firefighter to serve for a term of four years; the Alabama Association of Fire Chiefs shall nominate one certified firefighter to serve for a term of four years; the Alabama Association of Volunteer Fire Departments shall nominate one certified volunteer firefighter to serve for a term of four years; the State Fire Marshal or his or her designee shall serve as a member; the Lieutenant Governor shall nominate one member; and the Governor shall designate four <u>nominate one</u> members of the commission. The members appointed by the Lieutenant Governor the Governor shall each

1	serve for terms of four years; provided, that the members
2	first appointed by the Governor shall serve for terms of one,
3	two, three, and four years, respectively, as the Governor
4	shall designate. Should a vacancy occur during the term of a
5	commission member, the original nominating entity shall
6	nominate a replacement to serve for the remainder of the term.
7	Each nominee shall be confirmed by the Senate before the
8	nominee becomes a member of the commission. No commissioner
9	who is then serving on the commission or whose term has just
10	expired shall be required to be reconfirmed for a new term,
11	once nominated by the Professional Firefighters Association of
12	Alabama, the Alabama Firefighters Association, the Alabama
13	Association of Fire Chiefs, the Alabama Association of
14	Volunteer Fire Departments, the Lieutenant Governor or the
15	Governor. Each member of the commission shall serve until his
16	or her successor is confirmed by the Senate. If the Senate
17	rejects the nominee, the nominating entity shall make a
18	replacement nomination. The nominee of the Alabama Association
19	of Fire Chiefs shall be appointed in 2013 at the expiration of
20	the term of office of the designee of the Governor whose
21	appointment ends in 2013. The nominee of the Alabama
22	Association of Volunteer Fire Departments shall be appointed
23	in 2014 at the expiration of the term of office of the
24	designee of the Governor whose appointment ends in 2014. No
25	commissioner may serve more than two consecutive terms. The
26	members may adopt bylaws to govern the organization of the

commission, its meetings and activities; provided, that the bylaws shall not conflict with this chapter.

> (b) the membership of the commission shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state.

"(a) The commission shall elect a chairman and a vice-chairman from among its members at its the first regular quarterly meeting of the calendar year and thereafter at its first meeting following the appointment of a new member. The commission may employ an executive director who shall serve at the discretion of the commission. The commission may employ assistants to assist the executive director as required to coordinate training and to conduct investigations pursuant to Section 36-32-5 and any technical assistance programs. The assistants shall serve at the discretion of the commission. The commission shall set the salaries of the executive director and assistants subject to the salary schedules adopted by the Alabama State Board of Education for the Alabama state community, junior, and technical colleges. The commission may employ such clerical assistants as functions and duties may require. Final approval of hiring or dismissal of employees shall rest with the President of Shelton State Community College.

"(b) The commission may do all of the following:

1	"(1) Organize the Alabama Fire College by appointing
2	an executive director, assistant directors, and such officers
3	as the interest of the Alabama Fire College may require.
4	"(2) Remove the executive director or any assistant
5	or other officer.
6	"(3) Fix, increase, or reduce the compensation of
7	the executive director or any assistant or other officer.
8	"(4) Institute, regulate, alter, or modify the
9	government of the Alabama Fire College as the commission may
10	deem advisable.
11	"(5) Prescribe courses of instruction related to the
12	mission of the Alabama Fire College.
13	"(6) Establish the cost of any prescribed course of
14	study related to the mission of the Alabama Fire College.
15	"(7) Confer certifications as are usually conferred
16	by similar institutions related to the mission of the Alabama
17	Fire College.
18	"(c) The commission may delegate to the executive
19	director such powers and functions in the administration of
20	the affairs of the fire college as the commission may deem
21	proper, including the hiring, firing, dismissal, nonrenewal,
22	discipline, promotion, and supervision of any employee of the
23	Alabama Fire College and of the commission. The commission may
24	direct the executive director to coordinate the certification
25	of any person regulated by the commission, to conduct
26	investigations and fulfill other duties as provided in Section
27	36-32-5, and to provide any technical assistance programs. The

1 commission shall set the salaries of the faculty, administrative personnel, and support staff subject to the 2 salary schedule adopted by the commission. The salary schedule 3 4 adopted by the commission shall be identical to the salary schedule adopted by the State Board of Education for employees 5 of state community and technical colleges. The State Board of 6 7 Education may not be held liable for the failure of the commission to adopt such salary schedule. Employees of the 8 commission shall participate in the Teachers' Retirement 9 10 System of Alabama, subject to all rules, regulations, and conditions thereof and shall be considered employees as 11 12 defined in subdivision (1) of Section 16-25A-1. In the event an employee of the commission is receiving a monthly benefit 13 14 from the Teachers' Retirement System by virtue of his or her 15 retirement from employment with the commission, he or she shall be considered a retired employee as defined in 16 subdivision (2) of Section 16-25A-1, allowing participation in 17 the Public Education Employees' Health Insurance Plan, as 18 established in Chapter 25A of Title 16. 19

"(d) Members of the commission shall receive \$50.00 fifty dollars (\$50) per diem for attending meetings of the commission, plus travel expenses as provided for by state travel law, provided funds are available.

"(e) The commission, the Department of Postsecondary
Education, and any institution of postsecondary education may
contract with the commission for the provision of services to
students or for the fulfillment of the educational mission of

_	the Alabama file College. The Commission Shall report annually
2	to the State Examiner all expenditures and revenues and the
3	findings of the State Examiner shall be reported to the
4	commission and the committee. The commission shall be audited
5	by the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts in
6	accordance with Section 41-5-14.
7	"(f) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to
8	alter, amend, modify, repeal, or affect in any way the
9	provisions in Chapter 18, Title 22 of the Code of Alabama 1975
10	or to prohibit or limit in any way the authority of the
11	Alabama Department of Public Health to establish standards for
12	the training, qualification, scope of privilege,
13	certification, licensing of emergency medical services
14	personnel and for the operation, design, equipment and
15	licensing of ambulances, and ambulance service operators. The
16	Commission may authorize the Alabama Fire College to provide
17	education and training to firefighters and trainees in
18	emergency medical services, but only in a manner that complies

22	unless authorized by an act of the Alabama Legislature.

24	"The commission shall have the following functions
25	and duties together with all powers necessary or convenient
26	for the performance thereof:

"(1) To study, obtain data, statistics, and
information and make reports concerning the recruitment,
selection, and training of fire-protection personnel in the
state; to make recommendations for improvement in methods of
recruitment, selection, and training of such personnel;

- "(2) To recommend minimum curriculum requirements for schools operated for the specific purpose of training firefighter recruits or fire-protection personnel;
- "(3) To consider, hold public hearings on, adopt_ and promulgate such standards relating to trainees as fire-protection personnel as set forth by the commission;
- "(4) To consult and coordinate through memorandum of agreement or understanding when applicable with any fire-fighting agency, university, college, community college, the federal government or any branch thereof the Alabama State Fire College, or other educational institution concerning the provision of or development anywhere of, or both, firefighter training schools and programs of courses of instruction, including, but not limited to, education and training in the areas of fire science, fire technology, fire administration, and all allied and supporting fields, including travel out of the State of Alabama, for business, administrative, and instruction purposes which shall be authorized only by the commission and shall be allowed under the same conditions as for state officers and employees pursuant to Section 36-7-21;

"(5) To encourage the establishment of fire-fighting training schools and courses on fire fighting in the educational institutions in the state;

- "(6) To gather statistics and data and make reports concerning the training of fire-protection personnel and their accomplishments;
- "(7) To certify fire-fighting training and education programs as having attained the minimum required standards prescribed by such commission;
- "(8) To certify fire-protection personnel in respect to their competence to perform fire service duties at various defined levels of responsibility as prescribed by such commission;
- "(9) To direct research in the field of fire fighting and prevention and to accept gifts and grants for such purposes;
- "(10) To consult with national fire service organizations or agencies concerning the training and certification of fire-protection personnel in the state;
- "(11) To establish and utilize testing procedures and levels of grading which are consistently uniform with the standard prescribed by such commission;
- "(12) To make investigation to determine whether the requirements of this chapter and the rules, regulations and standards of the commission issued pursuant to this chapter are being observed and followed;

"(13) To recommend to the Attorney General, the
district attorneys and other appropriate officials measures
for the enforcement of the requirements of this chapter and
the rules, regulations and standards issued by the commission
pursuant to this chapter;

"(14) To enter into cooperative agreements with state and local fire-fighting agencies for the effective coordination of fire-fighting training in the state;

"(15) To obtain the services and advice of experts in the field of fire-fighting for the purpose of aiding the commission in its studies, consideration, reports and recommendations, and the adoption of standards, rules and regulations; and

"(16) To <u>encourage promote</u> the participation of local fire-fighting agencies in the programs established by the commission."

Section 2. Section 36-32-13 is added to the Code of Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

§36-32-13.

(a) There is created the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee of the Alabama Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education Commission. The committee shall be composed of three members of each house. The senator and the representative from the districts where the Alabama Fire College is located shall be members of the committee. The remaining members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House and the Senate Pro Tempore. The chair and vice chair of the oversight committee

shall be elected at the first meeting by the members of the oversight committee. The oversight committee shall meet as it deems necessary and shall study and oversee all facets of the Alabama Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education Commission. The committee shall review each report provided by the commission and may make recommendations as it deems appropriate.

- (b) Upon the request of the chair, the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives shall provide the clerical assistance necessary for the work of the oversight committee.
- entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, his or her per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of the oversight committee which shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the use of the Legislature, upon warrants drawn on the state Comptroller upon requisitions signed by the chair of the oversight committee. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no member shall receive additional legislative compensation or per diem when the Legislature is in session or if a member is being paid any other payments on the same dates for attendance of other state business.
- (d) The commission shall develop and adopt standards governing employment related issues pursuant to the state Merit System.

4	Section 3. This act shall become effective
5	immediately following its passage and approval by the
