8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, the possession of
9 certain named chemical compounds of synthetic
10 cannabinoid is prohibited and subject to criminal
11 penalties. Possession of the substances is a Class
12 C felony except possession for personal use on the

first offense is a Class A misdemeanor.

This bill would add certain named chemical compounds of synthetic cannabinoid to the law and would specify that any other chemical compound capable of exhibiting cannabinoid-like psychoactivity would be prohibited. Distribution of these compounds would be deemed unlawful, and violations would be subject to the existing criminal penalties for distribution and possession.

Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from

1 becoming effective with regard to a local 2 governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of 3 specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates 6 funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to 7 the entity for the purpose.

> The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

14	bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an
15	existing crime.
16	Section 3. This act shall become effective on the
17	first day of the third month following its passage and
18	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
