4 ENROLLED, An Act,

5 To amend Section 32-5A-263 of the Code of Alabama  
6 1975, relating to bicycles; to authorize a person riding a  
7 bicycle to give a hand signal for a right turn with his or her  
8 right arm and hand extended horizontally from the right side  
9 of the bicycle.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

11 Section 1. Section 32-5A-263 of the Code of Alabama  
12 1975, is amended to read as follows:

13 "§32-5A-263.

14 "(a) Every person operating a bicycle upon a roadway  
15 shall ride as near to the right side of the roadway as  
16 practicable, exercising due care when passing a standing  
17 vehicle or one proceeding in the same direction.

18 "(b) Persons riding bicycles upon a roadway shall  
19 not ride more than two abreast except on paths or parts of  
20 roadways set aside for the exclusive use of bicycles.

21 "(c) Wherever a usable path for bicycles has been  
22 provided adjacent to a roadway, bicycle riders shall use such  
23 path and shall not use the roadway.

24 "(d) A person riding a bicycle may give a hand  
25 signal for a right turn by extending his or her right arm and

1 hand horizontally on the right side of the bicycle. A child  
2 under the age of sixteen shall not be required to comply with  
3 the right side signalling."

4 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the  
5 first day of the third month following its passage and  
6 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
