1 WHEREAS, the state, as a steward for this valuable 2 resource, must plan and manage this resource to ensure its 3 availability for current and future generations; now 4 therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 5 6 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the waters of the state, as 7 defined in the Alabama Water Resources Act, are a natural resource owned by the state in trust for the public and 8 9 subject to the state's sovereign power to plan, regulate, and 10 control the withdrawal and use of those waters, under law, in order to protect public health, safety, and welfare by 11 12 promoting economic growth, mitigating the harmful effects of 13 drought, resolving conflicts among competing water users, 14 achieving balance between consumptive and non-consumptive uses of water, encouraging conservation, preventing significant 15 degradation of natural environments, and enhancing the 16 17 productivity of water-related activities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Alabama Office of Water Resources is requested to work with other agencies to ensure that this ownership role is reflected in on-going efforts to enhance water resource planning and management in Alabama.
