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8	WHEREAS, the growth of global space
9	commercialization and strong demand for launching satellites
10	and other commercial or military space launches present an
11	opportunity for the development of a commercial spaceport in
12	Alabama which would strengthen the state's economic vitality
13	through increased business activity; and
14	WHEREAS, it is important to enhance the quality of
15	life of all Alabamians by promoting increased economic
16	opportunity consistent with Alabama's heritage and values; and
17	WHEREAS, Alabama could enhance world recognition and

Community Affairs (ADECA), the Director of the Department of
Transportation (ALDOT), one member appointed by the Governor,
one member appointed by the Lieutenant Governor, two members
appointed by the Speaker of the House, and two members
appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we hereby express our support for the development of an Alabama Spaceport Authority and urge the Alabama Department of Transportation, the Department of Economic Development, the Alabama Board of Education, and other state agencies to provide their full cooperation and support for the development of a comprehensive plan for implementation and management of an Alabama Spaceport Authority.
