ESTABLISHING AN INTERIM ALABAMA JUDICIAL SYSTEM
STUDY COMMISSION.
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That there is established the
Interim Alabama Judicial System Study Commission.
(a) The commission shall be composed of the
following members:
(1) The Chief Justice of the Alabama Supreme Court.
(2) Two members of the Appellate Courts of Alabama.
(3) Two circuit judges chosen by the President of
the Circuit Judges Association.
(4) Two district judges chosen by the President of
the District Judges Association.
(5) A circuit clerk chosen by the President of the
Circuit Clerks Association.
(6) Three practicing attorneys chosen by the
President of the Alabama State Bar Association.
(7) One person appointed by the Governor.

(8) One person appointed by the Speaker of the House
 of Representatives.

3 (9) One person appointed by the President Pro
4 Tempore of the Senate.

5 (10) The Chairs of the Senate Finance and Taxation
6 Committee, General Fund, and the House Ways and Means
7 Committee, General Fund, or their designees.

8 (11) The Chairs of the Judiciary Committees of the
9 House of Representatives and the Senate, or their designees.

10 (12) The Director of the Administrative Office of 11 Courts.

12 (b) The commission shall select one of its members13 as chair.

14 (c) The Alabama Law Institute shall serve as staff
15 for the commission and shall assist the commission with
16 research and recommendations on the topics being studied and
17 shall draft any recommendations of the commission.

(d) The commission shall be charged with studying,
analyzing, and making proposals to the Legislature on the
following topics:

(1) The structure and function of the United
Judicial System, including the operations of the
Administrative Office of Courts.

(2) The jurisdictional structure of the judicial
system including jurisdiction of the courts by subject and
amount in controversy.

1 (3) Fees and costs associated with the 2 administration of the judicial system in Alabama including 3 court filing fees, convenience fees, and any other monies 4 collected in association with the filing and proceeding of 5 matters before the courts of Alabama, whether created by 6 statewide or local act.

7 (4) Compensation, retirement, and benefits of
8 judges, clerks, district attorneys, and all other employees
9 associated with the judicial system.

10 (5) Review the structure and purpose of the Judicial
11 Study Commission and the Judicial Compensation Commission.

12 (e) The commission shall report its findings, 13 conclusions, recommendations, and suggestions on these topics 14 no later than the third legislative day of the 2013 Regular 15 Legislative Session, where upon the commission shall stand dissolved of any further duty or liability. The report shall 16 17 be published on the Alabama State Bar website, the Administrative Office of Courts website, and also provided to 18 the Governor and the Finance Director. 19

20 (f) The members of the commission shall serve 21 without receiving any compensation, per diem, or expense 22 reimbursement.

(g) The membership of the commission shall be
inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic,
urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state.
