Section 13A-5-9.1, Code of Alabama 1975, 5 6 is repealed. 7 Section 2. This act shall be applied prospectively only. Any case, on the effective date of this act, in which a 8 motion filed pursuant to Section 13A-5-9.1, Code of Alabama 9 10 1975, is pending in the trial court or is subject to an appeal 11 or pending in an appellate court on appeal from the denial of 12 a motion shall not be affected by this act. Section 3. This act shall become effective 13 14 immediately following its passage and approval by the

Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
