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8	SYNOPSIS:	Under existing law, the driver of a motor
9		vehicle is required to move over or slow down when
10		approaching a parked law enforcement vehicle,
11		emergency vehicle, wrecker, or utility vehicle.
12		This bill would also require the driver of a
13		motor vehicle to yield the right-of-way and move
14		over or slow down when approaching a garbage,
15		trash, refuse, or recycling collection vehicle that
16		is actively engaged in the collection of garbage,
17		trash, refuse, or recycling materials.
18		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
19		of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the
20		Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
21		Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general
22		law whose purpose or effect would be to require a
23		new or increased expenditure of local funds from
24		becoming effective with regard to a local
25		governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote
26		unless: it comes within one of a number of
27		specified exceptions; it is approved by the

affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

14 AN ACT

Relating to motor vehicles; to amend Section 32-5A-58.2, Code of Alabama 1975, the Alabama Move Over Act, to include garbage, trash, refuse, or recycling collection vehicles in the type of vehicles on the roadside which the driver of another motor vehicle is required to move over or slow down when approaching; to require drivers to yield the right-of-way to garbage, trash, refuse, or recycling collection vehicles; to provide for traffic violations; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the

Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901,

2 as amended.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

4 Section 1. Section 32-5A-58.2, Code of Alabama 1975,

is amended to read as follows:

6 "\$32-5A-58.2.

7 "(a) This section shall be known as the "Alabama

8 Move Over Act."

"(b) (1) When an authorized law enforcement vehicle or emergency vehicle making use of any visual signals is parked, when a wrecker displaying amber rotating or flashing lights is performing a recovery or loading on the roadside, or when a utility service vehicle operated by or on behalf of an entity providing utility services displaying any rotating lights, flashing lights, or other visual signals is parked on the roadside while performing tasks associated with the provision of utility services, or when a garbage, trash, refuse, or recycling collection vehicle is actively collecting garbage, trash, refuse, or recycling materials on the roadside, the driver of every other vehicle, as soon as it is safe, shall do the following:

"a. When driving on an interstate highway or other highway with two or more lanes traveling in the direction of the law enforcement vehicle, emergency vehicle, wrecker, or utility service vehicle, or garbage, trash, refuse, or recycling collection vehicle, the driver shall vacate the lane closest to the law enforcement vehicle, emergency vehicle,

wrecker, or utility service vehicle, or garbage, trash,

refuse, or recycling collection vehicle, unless otherwise

directed by a law enforcement officer. If not safe to move

over, the driver shall slow to a speed that is at least 15

miles per hour less than the posted speed limit unless

otherwise directed by a law enforcement officer.

"b. When driving on a two-lane road, the driver shall move as far away from the law enforcement vehicle, emergency vehicle, wrecker, or utility service vehicle, or garbage, trash, refuse, or recycling collection vehicle as possible within his or her lane and slow to a speed that is 15 miles per hour less than the posted speed limit when the posted speed limit is 25 miles per hour or greater or travel at 10 miles per hour when the posted speed limit is 20 miles per hour or less, unless otherwise directed by a law enforcement officer.

"(2) A violation of this subsection is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of twenty-five dollars (\$25). Upon a second violation of this subsection, the fine shall be fifty dollars (\$50). Upon a third or subsequent violation, the fine shall be one hundred dollars (\$100).

"(c)(1) The Department of Public Safety shall provide an educational awareness campaign informing the motoring public about this section. The department shall provide information about this section in all newly printed driver's license educational materials after January 1, 2010.

"(2) This section shall not relieve the driver of an authorized emergency vehicle from the duty to drive with due regard for the safety of all persons using the highway."

Section 2. (a) The driver of a motor vehicle shall yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian worker engaged in the collection of garbage, trash, refuse, or recycling materials along a roadway whenever the driver is reasonably notified of the presence of the worker by the presence of a garbage, trash, refuse, or recycling collection vehicle or by a warning sign or device.

- (b) The driver of a motor vehicle on a public highway shall yield the right-of-way to a garbage, trash, refuse, or recycling collection vehicle that is stopped along a roadside or traveling in the same direction and which is engaged in the collection of garbage, trash, refuse, or recycling materials along a roadway or which has signaled and is reentering the traffic flow.
- (3) This section does not relieve the driver of a garbage, trash, refuse, or recycling collection vehicle from the duty to drive with due regard for the safety of all persons using the highway.
- (4) A person who violates this section shall be guilty of a traffic violation, punishable by a fine up to fifty dollars (\$50).

Section 3. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further

1 requirements and application under Amendment 621, now 2 appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the 3 bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an 4 5 existing crime. Section 4. This act shall become effective on the 6 7 first day of the third month following its passage and 8 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
