27	nlaintiff in any civil action for damages if the damages were

incurred as a consequence of the commission, attempted
commission, or flight subsequent to the commission or
attempted commission of a crime by the plaintiff and the use
of force by the defendant is justified.

- (b) A crime victim who causes injury or damages to an alleged perpetrator during the commission of a crime shall not be liable for civil damages as a result of his or her acts or omissions unless the act or omission was unreasonable under the circumstances and the result of the victim's willful or wanton misconduct.
- Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
