24	(1) For the fiscal years beginning October 1, 2013,

26	thousand dollars (\$175,000) shall be distributed among the
27	Hartselle, Decatur, and Morgan County school systems to be

- used expressly for the support and benefit of each system's robotics programs as follows:
- 3 a. Decatur -- \$77,000
  - b. Morgan County -- \$70,000
- 5 c. Hartselle -- \$28,000

- (2) For the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2013, until the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2022, four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) shall be divided equally between Athens State University and Calhoun Community College for the purpose of securing funding to build a Phase II for the Alabama Center for the Arts in downtown Decatur. The disbursement to each school shall be conditional upon the school initiating the project before or during the 2013-2014 fiscal year. Should the project not commence before October 1, 2014, the funds shall remain in an account until otherwise appropriated by legislative act.
- (3) Any funds distributed to Morgan County pursuant to Act 2010-135 after the appropriations provided above shall remain in account until otherwise appropriated by legislative act.
- 21 Section 2. Act 2011-267 of the 2011 Regular Session 22 (Acts 2011, p. 490) is repealed.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on

October 1, 2013, following its passage and approval by the

Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
