13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. Sections 28-11-2 and 28-11-13, Code of
15	Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
16	"§28-11-2.
17	"For purposes of this chapter, the following terms
18	have the following meanings unless the context clearly
19	indicates otherwise:
20	"(1) ALTERNATIVE NICOTINE PRODUCT. The term
21	alternative nicotine product includes electronic cigarettes
22	and alternative nicotine products as follows:
23	"a. Electronic cigarettes. An electronic cigarette
24	is an electronic product or device that produces a vapor that
25	delivers nicotine or other substances to the person inhaling
26	from the device to simulate smoking, and is likely to be
27	offered to or nurchased by consumers as an electronic

1	cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, or
2	electronic pipe.
3	"The term "electronic cigarette" does not include
4	any of the following:
5	"1. A cigarette or other tobacco product as defined
6	in this section.
7	"2. A product that is a drug under 21 U.S.C.
8	§321(q)(1).
9	"3. A product that is a device under 21 U.S.C.

1 "<del>(1)</del>(2) BOARD. The Alabama Alcoholic Beverage 2 Control Board. "(2)(3) DISTRIBUTION. To sell, barter, exchange, or 3 give tobacco or tobacco products for promotional purposes or for gratis. 5 "(3)(4) MINOR. Any person under the age of 19 years. 6 7 "(4)(5) PERSON. Any natural person, firm, partnership, association, company, corporation, or other 8 entity. Person does not include a manufacturer or wholesaler 9 10 of tobacco or tobacco products nor does it include employees of the permit holder. 11 "(5)(6) PROOF OF IDENTIFICATION. Any one or more of 12 13 the following documents used for purposes of determining the 14 age of a person purchasing, attempting to purchase, or 15 receiving tobacco or tobacco products: "a. A valid driver's license issued by any state and 16 17 bearing the photograph of the presenting person. "b. United States Uniform Service Identification. 18 "c. A valid passport. 19 "d. A valid identification card issued by any state 20 21 agency for the purpose of identification and bearing the 22 photograph and date of birth of the presenting individual. 23 "e. For legal mail order purposes only a valid 24 signed certification that will verify the individual is 19

1 "(6)(7) RESPONSIBLE VENDOR PROGRAM. A program 2 administered by the board to encourage and support vendors in training employees in legal and responsible sales practices. 3 "(7)(8) SAMPLER. Any business or person who distributes tobacco or tobacco products for promotional 5 6 purposes. 7 "<del>(8)</del>(9) SELF-SERVICE DISPLAY. A display that contains tobacco or tobacco products and is located in an area 8 9 openly accessible to purchasers at retail and from which such 10 purchasers can readily access tobacco or tobacco products 11 without the assistance of the tobacco permit holder or an 12 employee of the permit holder. A display case that holds 13 tobacco or tobacco products behind locked doors does not 14 constitute a self-service display. 15 "<del>(9)</del>(10) TOBACCO or TOBACCO PRODUCTS. Tobacco or any product containing tobacco, including, but not limited to, the 16 17 following: "a. Cigarettes. 18 "b. Cigars. 19 "c. Chewing tobacco. 20 "d. Snuff. 21 22 "e. Pipe tobacco. "f. Smokeless tobacco. 23 24 "(10)(11) TOBACCO PERMIT. A permit issued by the 25 board to allow the permit holder to engage in the distribution 26 of tobacco or tobacco products at the location identified in

the permit.

"(11)(12) TOBACCO SPECIALTY STORE. A business that
derives at least 75 percent of its revenue from tobacco or
tobacco products.

"\$28-11-13.

Unlawful behavior of minors. Unlawful for minors to purchase, use, possess, or transport tobacco, tobacco products, or alternative nicotine products.

"(a) It is unlawful for any minor to purchase, use, possess, or transport tobacco, or tobacco products, or alternative nicotine products within this state. It shall not be unlawful for a minor employee of a tobacco, tobacco product, or alternative nicotine product permit holder to handle, transport, or sell tobacco, or tobacco products, or alternative tobacco products if the minor employee is acting within the line and scope of employment and the permit holder, or an employee of the permit holder who is 21 years of age or older, is present.

"(b) It is unlawful for any minor to present or offer to another person proof of identification which is false, fraudulent, or not actually his or her own proof of identification in order to buy, receive, or otherwise obtain, or attempt to buy, receive, or otherwise obtain, any tobacco, or tobacco products, or alternative nicotine products."

(c) If a minor is cited for any violation under this section, the citing agency shall notify a parent, legal guardian, or legal custodian of the minor unless the minor has been emancipated by court order or operation of law.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
