Section 2. It shall be the duty of the revenue

commissioner, judge of probate, and sheriff to insure that the

employees of the respective offices exercise due care in

performing their required duties and make a diligent effort to

correct the error, mistake, or omission. The respective

officers shall make a good faith effort to collect the amount

subject to potential loss immediately upon becoming aware of

the potential loss.

Section 3. This act shall not apply to any deliberate misuse or misappropriation of funds by the revenue commissioner, judge of probate, or the sheriff, or by any clerk, or any employee of the respective officials.

Section 4. The revenue commissioner, judge of probate, or sheriff, or any official, any clerk, or any employee of the respective officials, shall not be liable for worthless checks if the respective officers make a good faith effort to collect on the worthless checks.

Section 5. The provisions of this act are severable. If any part of this act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, that declaration shall not affect the part which remains.

Section 6. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
