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SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, a list of registered 8 voters is required to be published in a newspaper 9 10 of general circulation in the county prior to each 11 regular primary election. Additionally, a list of 12 the registered voters to be removed from the voters 13 list is required to be published when statewide voter file maintenance is conducted. Also under 14 existing law, notice of all elections and a list of 15 16 inspectors and clerks for an election are required 17 to be published in a newspaper of general 18 circulation in the county.

19 This bill would eliminate the requirement to 20 publish these lists and notices, except the lists 21 of voters to be removed, and have this information 22 posted on the county website, or if there is no 23 website maintained by the county, on the website of 24 the Association of County Commissions of Alabama. 25 This bill would also require that this information would be available for review upon request at no 26 27 cost and that the county place a display

1 advertisement at least one-half page in size in 2 some newspaper of general circulation in the county providing information about where the lists and 3 4 notices are available. 5 This bill would limit payment to one list per election. 6 7 A BILL 8 TO BE ENTITLED 9 10 AN ACT 11 12 To amend Sections 17-4-1, 17-4-10, and 17-9-5, Code 13 of Alabama 1975, to remove the requirement to publish certain 14 lists of registered voters and inspectors and clerks and 15 election notices in a newspaper of general circulation in the 16 county; to require the information to be posted on a county 17 website and made available upon request at no cost to the person making this request; to require the county to place a 18 display advertisement in a newspaper of general circulation in 19 20 the county identifying where voter list and election notice 21 information is available. 22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: Section 1. Sections 17-4-1, 17-4-10, and 17-9-5, 23 24 Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows: "§17-4-1. 25 "The (a) On or before the twentieth day preceding 26 27 the regularly scheduled primary election, the judge of probate

1 shall publish from the state voter registration list post on 2 the website of the county a correct alphabetical list of qualified electors from the state voter registration list 3 either by county, precinct, district, or subdivision wherein 4 5 each elector is registered to vote, in some newspaper with 6 general circulation in the county, on or before the twentieth 7 day preceding the regularly scheduled primary election. If the county does not maintain a website, the list shall be posted 8 on the website of the Association of County Commissions of 9 10 Alabama. The list shall also be available upon request at no cost from the office of the judge of probate and copies shall 11 12 be posted for review in other public buildings. In addition to 13 the posting, the county shall give notice by placing a display 14 advertisement at least one-half page in size for two 15 consecutive weeks in a newspaper with general circulation in the county meeting the requirements for publication of legal 16 17 notices pursuant to Sections 6-8-60 and 6-8-64. Provided, however, for the first primary election following the 18 reapportionment of the Alabama Legislature, the display 19 advertisement shall be published in each newspaper with 20 21 general circulation in the county meeting the requirements for 22 publication of legal notices pursuant to Sections 6-8-60 and 23 6-8-64. The advertisement shall include the website address 24 where the list can be obtained, state that the list will be 25 available at no cost from the office of the judge of probate, 26 and include contact information for the office of the judge of 27 probate.

1 "(b) The list of qualified electors prepared by the 2 judge of probate shall be accompanied by a printed certification generated by the state voter registration system 3 4 verifying that the list contains the names of all qualified electors registered as of the specified time and date when it 5 was printed. The list shall further state that any elector 6 7 whose name was inadvertently omitted from the list shall have 10 days in which to have his or her name entered upon the list 8 of qualified voters. 9

10 "(c) If within 10 days after the list of qualified electors is made available, any voter shall reasonably satisfy 11 12 the board of registrars by proper proof that any name should 13 be added to the list, the board shall add such the name of the 14 voter to the list. The supplemental list of registered voters 15 inadvertently omitted from the original list shall be 16 published once in a newspaper of general circulation in the 17 county posted on the county's website or, if the county does not maintain a website, on the website of the Association of 18 County Commissions of Alabama, on or before the seventh day 19 preceding the date of the primary election and the 20 21 availability of the list shall be noted in the display advertisement required by subsection (a). The lists required 22 23 to be published pursuant to this section may be published, at 24 the discretion of the county commission, as a preprinted or 25 inserted advertising supplement at a cost no greater than the 26 selected newspaper's lowest applicable national insertion 27 rates. If the list is published as a preprinted supplement in

1 the selected newspaper, the supplement size shall conform to 2 the size requirements set by the selected newspaper and shall be printed on standard newsprint paper. The type size shall be 3 4 no smaller than nine point standard type. The list shall also 5 be delivered to the newspaper for insertion in a manner required for other advertising supplements. The supplement may 6 7 not contain any other advertising. Any newspaper accepting a 8 preprinted insertion that is not prepared by the newspaper 9 shall not be responsible for the content of such insertion. 10 The list shall also be made available upon request at no cost from the office of the judge of probate and copies shall be 11 12 posted for review in other public buildings. Nothing in this 13 section shall prohibit a county commission from publishing the 14 list of voters qualified electors in more than one any 15 newspaper within the county at the county commission's discretion. 16

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"§17-4-10.

"The names of persons in the county to be struck 18 from the list of registered voters shall be listed by precinct 19 20 and in alphabetical order and published in a newspaper of 21 general circulation in the county meeting the requirements for publication of legal notices pursuant to Sections 6-8-60 and 22 23 6-8-64 once a week and posted on the county's website for at 24 least two consecutive weeks in November or December of each 25 year in which the statewide voter file maintenance is 26 conducted. If the county does not maintain a website, the list 27 shall be posted on the website of the Association of County

1	Commissions of Alabama. The list shall also be available at no
2	cost to the requestor from the judge of probate's office and
3	copies shall be posted for review in other public buildings.
4	Provided, however, for the first voter file maintenance
5	process following the reapportionment of the Alabama
6	Legislature, the list required by this section shall be
7	published in each newspaper with general circulation in the
8	county meeting the requirements for publication of legal
9	notices pursuant to Sections 6-8-60 and 6-8-64. The county
10	shall place a display advertisement at least one-quarter page
11	in size in a newspaper with general circulation in the county.
12	The advertisement shall include the website address where the
13	list can be obtained, state that the list will be available
14	upon request at no cost from the office of the judge of
15	probate, and include contact information for the office of the
16	judge of probate.
17	"§17-9-5.
18	"The judge of probate must give notice <u>of each</u>
19	<u>election</u> at least 30 days before each <u>the</u> election by
20	publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the
21	county, if any is published therein and, if not, by writings
22	posted posting notice on the county's website, at the
23	courthouse door, and at three other public places in the
24	county, of . If the county does not maintain a website, the
25	notice shall be posted on the website of the Association of
26	County Commissions of Alabama. In addition, the county shall
27	place a display advertisement of at least one-quarter page in

1 size in a newspaper with general circulation in the county 2 meeting the requirements for publication of legal notices pursuant to Sections 6-8-60 and 6-8-64. The advertisement 3 4 shall include the website address where the notice of election may be obtained. The notice of election available on the 5 website and at the courthouse and other public places shall 6 7 include the time of holding the election and the offices to be filled by such the election. Such The notice shall consist 8 only of the date of the election and the officers to be voted 9 10 for or subjects to be voted on."

11 Section 2. This act shall become effective 12 immediately following its passage and approval by the 13 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law and shall apply to any 14 election cycle commencing after the effective date of the act.
