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Relating to Baldwin County; to authorize the Baldwin County Commission to regulate the permitting, construction, placement, and operation of wind turbines, wind mills, wind farms and any other wind-generated energy production facilities or equipment operated, in whole or in part, by wind in the unincorporated areas of Baldwin County, Alabama; to authorize the Baldwin County Commission to establish standards, specifications, criteria, and conditions on the permitting, construction, placement, and operation of wind turbines, wind mills, wind farms, and any other wind-generated energy production facilities or equipment operated, in whole or in part, by wind in the unincorporated areas of Baldwin County; to authorize and allow the Baldwin County Commission to determine the appropriate locations where wind turbines, wind mills, wind farms, and any other wind-generated energy production facilities or equipment operated, in whole or in part, by wind may be located or allowed and to prohibit the same, if deemed necessary by the Baldwin County Commission; to authorize and allow the Baldwin County Commission to establish remedies and penalties for the violation of any laws,

ordinances, rules, or regulations adopted pursuant to this act; to authorize the Baldwin County Commission to determine the terms and conditions of any exceptions and exemptions from the provisions of any laws, ordinances, rules, or regulations adopted pursuant to this act; and to provide that the authority granted to the Baldwin County Commission pursuant to this act shall be in addition to, and not in substitution of, any powers or authority granted to the Baldwin County Commission pursuant to any other laws, rules or regulations.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. This act shall apply within all unincorporated areas of Baldwin County.

Section 2. (a) The county commission shall have zoning zoning authority and the power to establish and adopt ordinances, resolutions, rules, regulations, and procedures to regulate the permitting, construction, placement, and operation of wind turbines, windmills, wind farms, and any other wind-generated energy production facilities or equipment operated, in whole or in part, by wind, sometimes referred to collectively as "wind-generated energy production facilities," also including, but not limited to, regulations regarding the size, location, and noise generated by wind-generated energy production facilities. The regulations shall be adopted by ordinance or resolution of the county commission at a regularly scheduled meeting of the commission.

(b) The county commission shall have zoning zoning authority and the power to establish and adopt ordinances,

resolutions, rules, regulations, and procedures establishing standards, specifications, criteria, and conditions related to the permitting, construction, placement, and operation of wind turbines, wind mills, wind farms, and any other wind-generated energy production facilities or equipment operated, in whole or in part, by wind in the unincorporated areas of Baldwin County.

(c) The county commission shall have zoning zoning authority and the power to establish and adopt ordinances, rules, regulations, policies, and procedures to establish and determine the appropriate locations where wind turbines, wind mills, wind farms, and any other wind-generated energy production facilities or equipment operated, in whole or in part, by wind may be located or allowed and to prohibit the same, if deemed necessary by the county commission.

As part of the commission's authority, the commission is to provide for a minimum setback for wind-generated energy production facilities that is no closer laterally than one and one-half times the height of the tower to an overhead electrical power line, excluding secondary electrical service lines or service drops. The commission may also provide for a minimum setback from underground electrical and gas distribution lines.

(d) If any building or structure is erected, constructed, altered, repaired, converted, operated, or maintained, or if any land is used, in violation of this act or any ordinance, resolution, rule, regulation, or procedure

1 promulgated under the authority conferred by this act, the county commission, or other appropriate administrative officer designated by the county commission, may institute any 3 appropriate action or proceeding to prevent an unlawful erection, construction, reconstruction, alteration, repair, 6 conversion, operation, maintenance, or use of the land or to 7 restrain, correct, or abate the violation, or to prevent the use of any building or structure, or to prevent any illegal act, conduct, business, or misuse in or upon any premises regulated under the authority conferred by this act. In addition to the foregoing, the county commission may adopt 11 12 ordinances or regulations providing for a penalty in the form 13 of a fine for the violation of the provisions of any ordinance, resolution, rule, regulation, or procedure promulgated under this act. The fine shall not exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) and costs of court for each 17 offense. Each day the violation continues shall constitute a separate offense. In addition, any violation shall be a public nuisance. Upon a finding that a building or structure violates 19 the provisions of any ordinance, resolution, rule, regulation, 20 21 or procedure adopted pursuant to this act, the county 22 commission may remove such building or structure, and all 23 costs of removal shall be assessed against the landowner and recorded as a lien on the property and may be enforced until 25 satisfied.

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(e) The county commission may levy permit and application fees deemed necessary to administer the

ordinances, resolutions, rules, regulations, or procedures adopted pursuant to this act. The fees shall cover the cost of administrative activities and the cost of reviewing applications, including the costs or fees of any experts or consultants deemed necessary to assist the county in reviewing applications.

- and power to establish rules and procedures to determine the terms and conditions of any exceptions and exemptions from the provisions of any laws, ordinances, rules, or regulations adopted pursuant to this act. In addition, any ordinance or resolution adopted pursuant to this act shall authorize a variance process to be determined by the county commission. Furthermore, any ordinance or resolution adopted pursuant to this act shall include a variance appeals process for any party aggrieved by a final variance decision of the county commission to appeal therefrom to the Circuit Court of Baldwin County.
- (g) The authority granted to the county commission pursuant to this act shall be in addition to, and not in substitution of, any powers or authority granted to the County Commission pursuant to any other laws, rules or regulations.

Nothing in this Act shall serve to alter, affect,

limit or avoid other state laws and regulations that would

otherwise be applicable to the permitting, construction,

placement, or operation of wind-generated energy production

1	facilities, or to sales therefrom, including but not limited
2	to the provisions of Title 37.
3	Section 3. The provisions of this act are severable
4	If any part of this act is declared invalid or
5	unconstitutional, that declaration shall not affect the part
6	which remains
7	Section 4. All laws or parts of laws which conflict
8	with this act are repealed to the extent of such conflict.
9	Section 5. This act shall become effective
10	immediately following its passage and approval by the
11	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
