2 ENROLLED, House Joint Resolution,  
3 MOURNING THE DEATH OF MR. CARROLL DAUGHERTY.

5 WHEREAS, it is with profound sorrow that we mourn  
6 the death of Mr. Carroll Daugherty of McIntosh, Alabama, on  
7 March 14, 2013, at the age of 84 years; and

8 WHEREAS, his passing leaves a void in the lives of  
9 his loving family and his many friends; he was the highly  
10 regarded Mayor of the Town of McIntosh for 42 years; and

11 WHEREAS, born on November 20, 1928, he was a  
12 graduate of Leroy High School and Huffstetler Business School  
13 in Mobile; and

14 WHEREAS, Mr. Daugherty was retired from the Building  
15 and Trades Union as a representative for 17,000 union  
16 personnel from Pensacola to Birmingham, having served for 32  
17 years as the Business Union Representative of Millwright Local  
18 2734 in Mobile; he also was Secretary of Carpenters,  
19 Millwright, and Pile Drivers, Mobile District Council, for 29  
20 years, President of the Alabama State Council of Carpenters  
21 for 18 years, and Administrator and Business Manager for the  
22 Mobile-Pensacola AFL-CIO Building Trades Council Health and  
23 Pension Plan for eight years; and

24 WHEREAS, Mr. Daugherty attended McIntosh United  
25 Methodist Church, serving as a Trustee and Board member; he

1 was a staunch supporter of the McIntosh Rescue Squad and  
2 McIntosh Police Department and helped set up and maintain the  
3 McIntosh Volunteer Fire Department; he was also a member of  
4 the local Emergency Planning Committee and helped organize  
5 Community Action Panels for Ciba and Olin; and

6 WHEREAS, Mr. Daugherty helped establish McIntosh  
7 Christian Academy; was one of the founders and board members  
8 of Southwest Bank; was a Charter member and among the  
9 organizers of the McIntosh Betterment Association; helped  
10 create the McIntosh Public Library Branch of the Washington  
11 County Library; and was a former Board member of the Sheriffs'  
12 Boys Ranch; and

13 WHEREAS, his additional community contributions  
14 included: former board member of Friends of Searcy Hospital;  
15 board member of North Mobile Community Hospital; and Executive  
16 Board member of the State Building Trades Council; he was  
17 appointed to serve as Secretary of the Charter Board of Prime  
18 Health-HMO of Mobile and as a member of the Board of Directors  
19 of the Alabama Department of Labor Management Committee; he  
20 was a member of the President's Club under the Carter  
21 Administration; and

22 WHEREAS, in 2003, he was inducted into the  
23 Washington County Wall of Fame; and

24 WHEREAS, survivors include his son, Cris (Brenda)  
25 Daugherty; daughters, Nancy (Ronny) Jarrell, and Jeanine

1 (Raymond) Payne; siblings, Velma Patrick, Bernice Rocray,  
2 Betty Milstead, Gerald Daugherty, and Bonnie McGee; eight  
3 grandchildren; nine great-grandchildren; very special friend,  
4 Mary Lee Johnson; and numerous other relatives and friends; he  
5 was predeceased by his wife of 59 years, Melva Jean Allen  
6 Daugherty; parents, Hiram and Nona Hilderbrant Daugherty; and  
7 siblings, Ruth Everette, Helen Touchstone, Marvin Daugherty,  
8 and Elwood Daugherty; and

9 WHEREAS, Mr. Daugherty was a valued member of the  
10 community; although his presence will be greatly missed, his  
11 memory will be cherished in the hearts of those who were  
12 fortunate to know him; now therefore,

13 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH  
14 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the death of Mr. Carroll  
15 Daugherty is recorded with deep sadness, and this resolution  
16 is offered in tribute to his life and with heartfelt sympathy  
17 to his family, whose grief is shared by many.
