8 MOURNING THE DEATH OF MR. CARROLL DAUGHERTY.

10 WHEREAS, it is with profound sorrow that we mourn
11 the death of Mr. Carroll Daugherty of McIntosh, Alabama, on
12 March 14, 2013, at the age of 84 years; and

13 WHEREAS, his passing leaves a void in the lives of
14 his loving family and his many friends; he was the highly
15 regarded Mayor of the Town of McIntosh for 42 years; and

16 WHEREAS, born on November 20, 1928, he was a
17 graduate of Leroy High School and Huffstetler Business School
18 in Mobile; and

19 WHEREAS, Mr. Daugherty was retired from the Building
20 and Trades Union as a representative for 17,000 union
21 personnel from Pensacola to Birmingham, having served for 32
22 years as the Business Union Representative of Millwright Local
23 2734 in Mobile; he also was Secretary of Carpenters,
24 Millwright, and Pile Drivers, Mobile District Council, for 29
25 years, President of the Alabama State Council of Carpenters
26 for 18 years, and Administrator and Business Manager for the

1 Mobile-Pensacola AFL-CIO Building Trades Council Health and
2 Pension Plan for eight years; and

3 WHEREAS, Mr. Daugherty attended McIntosh United
4 Methodist Church, serving as a Trustee and Board member; he
5 was a staunch supporter of the McIntosh Rescue Squad and
6 McIntosh Police Department and helped set up and maintain the
7 McIntosh Volunteer Fire Department; he was also a member of
8 the local Emergency Planning Committee and helped organize
9 Community Action Panels for Ciba and Olin; and

10 WHEREAS, Mr. Daugherty helped establish McIntosh
11 Christian Academy; was one of the founders and board members
12 of Southwest Bank; was a Charter member and among the
13 organizers of the McIntosh Betterment Association; helped
14 create the McIntosh Public Library Branch of the Washington
15 County Library; and was a former Board member of the Sheriffs'
16 Boys Ranch; and

17 WHEREAS, his additional community contributions
18 included: former board member of Friends of Searcy Hospital;
19 board member of North Mobile Community Hospital; and Executive
20 Board member of the State Building Trades Council; he was
21 appointed to serve as Secretary of the Charter Board of Prime
22 Health-HMO of Mobile and as a member of the Board of Directors
23 of the Alabama Department of Labor Management Committee; he
24 was a member of the President's Club under the Carter
25 Administration; and

1 WHEREAS, in 2003, he was inducted into the
2 Washington County Wall of Fame; and

3 WHEREAS, survivors include his son, Cris (Brenda)
4 Daugherty; daughters, Nancy (Ronny) Jarrell, and Jeanine
5 (Raymond) Payne; siblings, Velma Patrick, Bernice Rocray,
6 Betty Milstead, Gerald Daugherty, and Bonnie McGee; eight
7 grandchildren; nine great-grandchildren; very special friend,
8 Mary Lee Johnson; and numerous other relatives and friends; he
9 was predeceased by his wife of 59 years, Melva Jean Allen
10 Daugherty; parents, Hiram and Nona Hilderbrant Daugherty; and
11 siblings, Ruth Everette, Helen Touchstone, Marvin Daugherty,
12 and Elwood Daugherty; and

13 WHEREAS, Mr. Daugherty was a valued member of the
14 community; although his presence will be greatly missed, his
15 memory will be cherished in the hearts of those who were
16 fortunate to know him; now therefore,

17 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
18 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the death of Mr. Carroll
19 Daugherty is recorded with deep sadness, and this resolution
20 is offered in tribute to his life and with heartfelt sympathy
21 to his family, whose grief is shared by many.
