23	Management at Tarleton State University in Stephenville,
24	Texas, he worked as a ranch hand; as a young man, he was also
25	a professional bronc rider; he then enlisted in the U.S. Navy
26	with a strong desire to join the SEALS; and

WHEREAS, a member of SEAL Team 3, Sniper Element
Charlie Platoon within the Naval Special Warfare Command, he
served four combat deployments in Iraq and earned the
distinction of being one of the leading U.S. military snipers
of all time; notably, he received two Silver Stars, five
Bronze Stars with Valor, two Navy and Marine Corps Achievement
Medals, one Navy and Marine Corps Commendation, and the
Grateful Nation Award, given by the Jewish Institute for
National Security Affairs; and

WHEREAS, after leaving the Navy in 2009, he moved to Midlothian, Texas, with his beloved and devoted wife, Taya, and two cherished children; he served as the chief instructor for training Naval Special Warfare Sniper and Counter-Sniper teams and wrote the first Navy SEAL sniper manual; his autobiographical book, "American Sniper": The Autobiography of the Most Lethal Sniper in U.S. Military History, which he co-authored with Scott McEwen and Jim DeFelice, was released by Harper Collins in 2012 and became a global best seller; he co-founded Craft International and helped establish FITCO Cares Foundation to serve in-need veterans; additionally, he became a reality television personality on Stars Earn Stripes; and

WHEREAS, through the years, Chris Kyle earned immense respect for his tireless dedication and exceptional abilities; his unwavering commitment to excellence in the defense of freedom and democracy reflects honor upon the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, Chris Kyle was a valued citizen of the United States; even though he is greatly missed, his memory is cherished in the hearts and minds of those who were fortunate enough to know him; now therefore,
