8 CREATING THE JOINT INTERIM LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE TO
9 STUDY HOME SCHOOL ACCESS TO PUBLIC SCHOOL EXTRACURRICULAR
10 ACTIVITIES.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Joint Interim Legislative Committee to Study Home School Access to Public School Extracurricular Activities is created. The membership of the committee shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban and rural, and economic diversity of the state. The chair and vice chair of the committee shall be elected at the first meeting by the members of the committee. The committee shall study all facets relating to the participation of students instructed at home by a private tutor or pursuant to church school law in athletics and other extracurricular activities offered by public K-12 schools. The committee shall be composed of the following members:

(1) Four members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

- 1 (2) Three members of the Senate, appointed by the 2 President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
- 3 (3) One member of the Board of Directors of the 4 Alabama Association of School Boards, as selected by the 5 membership of the board.

- (4) One member of the Board of Directors of the School Superintendents of Alabama, as selected by the membership of the board.
- (5) One member of the Executive Committee of the Council for Leaders in Alabama Schools, as selected by the membership of the committee.
- (6) One member representing the State Department of Education, as appointed by the State Superintendent of Education.
- (7) Two members appointed by the Central Board of the Alabama High School Athletic Association, as selected by the membership of the board.
- (8) One member of the governing body of the Alabama Independent School Association, as selected by the membership of the body.
- (9) Four members who currently home school, with two being appointed each by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

Upon the request of the chair, the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives shall provide necessary clerical assistance for the work of the committee. The committee shall report its findings,

conclusions, and recommendations to the Legislature not later than the fifth legislative day of the 2014 Regular Session, whereupon the committee shall stand dissolved and discharged of any further duties and liabilities.

Each legislative member of the committee shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, his or her per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of the committee, which shall be paid out of any funds appropriated for the use of the Legislature, upon warrants drawn by the Comptroller, upon requisitions signed by the committee chair. Legislative members may not receive additional legislative compensation or per diem for a regular or special session meeting day or committee meeting day of any special or regular session, or if a member is being paid any other payments on the same dates for attendance on other state business. Nonlegislative members of the committee may be reimbursed for meetings according to the policies and procedures of the respective agencies and groups represented.

The total expenditures of the committee shall not exceed \$1,000.
