25	WHEREAS, a pioneer of space and missile defense, Dr.
26	Davidson's distinguished career spanned nearly 60 years; his

technical expertise combined with unparalleled leadership
talents propelled him through a long and illustrious career

lives on in many of the technologies in use today in the
development of our space and missile defense systems; and

WHEREAS, the employees of Davidson Technologies are especially saddened because Dr. Davidson was a friend and mentor, and his kind, humble, and gentle spirit inspired everyone who worked for him; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Davidson is remembered for his generosity in the Huntsville community; he and his wife,
Dorothy, donated \$2 million to boost fund-raising efforts for the 68,000 square-foot, \$22 million Davidson Center for Space Exploration at the U.S. Space & Rocket Center; the Davidson Center, which opened in 2008, houses a restored original Saturn V rocket, one of only three remaining in the world, and the center has become a premiere tourist attraction in North Alabama; and

WHEREAS, the Davidsons also generously contributed \$2 million toward the construction of the Davidson Center for the Arts at the Huntsville Museum of Art; and
