8 SYNOPSIS: There are currently several funds in the
9 state accounting system which support specific
10 functions of government. The state general fund,
11 which is appropriated for the Executive,
12 Legislative and Judicial functions of the state,
13 does not receive a portion of some of these funds
14 in order to help offset the costs of providing
15 services such as accounting, auditing, budgeting,
16 and legal services to the entities supported by
17 those funds. This bill will authorize the transfer
18 of certain funds into the State General Fund
19 beginning with the fiscal year ending September 30,
20 2014 and each fiscal year thereafter.

26 To provide for the transfer of certain state funds
27 into the State General Fund to help offset the costs of

1 services provided by agencies which receive appropriations
2 from the State General Fund.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

4 Section 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of
5 law to the contrary, in order to provide for an increase in
6 receipts into the State General Fund for the funding of the
7 operations of state government, there is hereby established
8 the authority to transfer from the several state departments,
9 state funds in those amounts as are annually specified in the
10 State General Fund appropriations act beginning with the
11 fiscal year ending September 30, 2014 and each fiscal year
12 thereafter. Such transfers shall be for the purpose of
13 providing funds to help offset the costs of state services
14 provided to the several departments by state entities which
15 are supported by appropriations from the State General Fund.

16 Section 2. This act shall not apply to any state
17 funds which are designated for a specific purpose by the state
18 constitution.

19 Section 3. All laws or parts of laws which conflict
20 with this act are repealed.

21 Section 4. This act shall become effective October
22 1, 2013.
