## AN ACT

11 Relating to public safety; to create the Alabama 12 State Law Enforcement Agency; to create the Secretary of the 13 Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency to coordinate various law 14 enforcement and investigative services and serve as the 15 Homeland Security Advisor for this state; to create the Public Safety Fund; to create the State Bureau of Investigations to 16 17 assume the duties and functions of the Alabama Bureau of Investigation; to transfer certain enforcement and 18 investigative functions of certain agencies to the State 19 Bureau of Investigations; to transfer all functions of the 20 21 Alabama Department of Homeland Security to the Secretary of 22 the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency; to transfer certain 23 enforcement functions of certain agencies to the Department of 24 Public Safety; to create new divisions within the Department 25 of Public Safety; to require the Code Commissioner to make 26 conforming changes in the code; and to amend Sections 41-9-592 27 and 41-9-593, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the Criminal

Justice Information Center Commission, to provide that the
 Secretary of the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency would be
 the chairman of the commission.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

5 Section 1. The Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency 6 is hereby created within the Executive Branch of State 7 Government to coordinate public safety in this state. The 8 Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency shall be comprised of the 9 following:

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(1) The Department of Public Safety.

(2) The State Bureau of Investigations.

12 Section 2. (a) The position of Secretary of the 13 Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency is created. The secretary 14 shall serve as the appointing authority and executive head of 15 the agency and the appointing authority and department head of the Department of Public Safety and State Bureau of 16 17 Investigations. The secretary may delegate all or part of the functions of appointing authority and department head for the 18 department and bureau to the Director of the Department of 19 Public Safety and the Director of the State Bureau of 20 21 Investigations, respectively.

(b) (1) The secretary shall be appointed by and hold
office at the pleasure of the Governor, and shall serve until
his or her successor is appointed. The salary of the secretary
shall be set by the Governor, and shall not be subject to
Section 36-6-6, Code of Alabama 1975.

(2) A person appointed secretary shall have an
 extensive law enforcement background and, by virtue of office,
 is a state law enforcement officer with the immunity set forth
 in Section 6-5-338, Code of Alabama 1975.

5 (c) The secretary is a member of the Governor's
6 Cabinet who shall advise the Governor on matters of public
7 safety.

(d) The secretary shall serve as the Homeland 8 Security Advisor for this state, assume all duties of the 9 Director of Homeland Security, including all functions of the 10 Alabama Fusion Center, and shall be responsible for 11 12 coordinating, designing, and implementing Alabama's program 13 for homeland security, including immigration enforcement. The 14 secretary shall be the principal point of contact between the State of Alabama and the federal government with respect to 15 homeland security issues. Any reference in law to the 16 17 authority of the Director of Homeland Security shall be deemed a reference to the Secretary of the Alabama State Law 18 Enforcement Agency. The secretary may delegate all or a 19 portion of the functions required by this section to the State 20 21 Bureau of Investigations.

22 Section 3. (a) The Secretary of the Alabama State 23 Law Enforcement Agency shall establish general policies for 24 the Department of Public Safety and the State Bureau of 25 Investigations.

(b) The secretary shall coordinate efforts within
 the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency and the entities

therein to promote the recruitment, selection, and training of state law enforcement officers in the agency.

3 (c) (1) A Protective Services Unit is created in the
4 office of the secretary. The unit is vested with all functions
5 of the Dignitary Protection Services of the Department of
6 Public Safety, and a reference in any law to the Dignitary
7 Protection Services of the Department of Public Safety shall
8 be deemed a reference to the Protective Services Unit.

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(2) The secretary shall appoint a chief of the unit.

10 (d) The secretary is vested with all functions of 11 the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs 12 relating to law enforcement planning, excluding functions 13 related to the procurement, administration, awarding, or 14 disbursement of any of the following grants:

15 (1) Sexual Assault.

16 (2) Crime Victims Assistance.

17 (3) Violence Against Women.

- 18 (4) Family Violence Prevention and Services.
- 19 (5) Highway Safety Traffic, including

20 Click-It-or-Ticket and car seats.

21

(6) Social and Human Services.

(e) Investigators employed on the effective date of
this section by the State Office of Prosecution Services as
computer forensics investigators/analysts in the Alabama
Computer Forensics Labs shall be transferred to the Alabama
Fusion Center and shall receive a rank and classification in

1 the state Merit System equivalent to their current employment 2 rank or years of service.

Section 4. (a) There is hereby created the Public 3 4 Safety Fund in the State Treasury. The fund consists of all monies appropriated for support of the functions of the 5 Secretary of the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency, 6 7 Department of Public Safety, and the State Bureau of Investigations, including funds transferred to any of the 8 foregoing pursuant to Section 9. Any monies in the fund from a 9 10 source that restricts the use of the funds to a certain purpose or that are appropriated for a particular purpose may 11 12 be expended only for that purpose.

(b) Subject to subsection (a), the Secretary of the
Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency may expend monies in the
Public Safety Fund for the support of the Secretary, the
Department of Public Safety, and the State Bureau of
Investigations.

18 Section 5. (a) The State Bureau of Investigations is 19 hereby created in the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency. 20 The bureau shall succeed to and be vested with all powers of 21 the Alabama Bureau of Investigation. A reference in any law to 22 the Alabama Bureau of Investigation shall be deemed a 23 reference to the State Bureau of Investigations.

(b) The position of Director of the State Bureau of
Investigations is created. The director shall be appointed by
the Secretary of the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency,
after consultation with the Governor, and shall hold office at

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the pleasure of the secretary. The salary of the director shall be set by the secretary, and shall not be subject to Section 36-6-6, Code of Alabama 1975. A person appointed director shall have an extensive law enforcement background and, by virtue of office, is a state law enforcement officer with the immunity set forth in Section 6-5-338, Code of Alabama 1975.

(c) The bureau succeeds to and is vested with all 8 functions of the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center. 9 A reference in any law to the Alabama Criminal Justice 10 Information Center shall be deemed a reference to a division 11 12 of the State Bureau of Investigations. The Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center Commission shall continue to 13 14 function in an advisory capacity to the bureau regarding 15 functions previously performed by the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center. 16

(d) The bureau succeeds to and is vested with all investigative functions of the following investigative and enforcement units, and a reference in any law to these investigation and enforcement units shall be deemed a reference to the State Bureau of Investigations:

(1) The law enforcement unit of the AlabamaAlcoholic Beverage Control Board.

24 (2) The investigative unit of the Alabama Forestry25 Commission.

26 (3) The investigative unit of the Department of27 Agriculture and Industries.

1 (e) The Director of the State Bureau of 2 Investigations shall have overall supervision and management of functions transferred to the bureau pursuant to this 3 4 section, subject to approval by the secretary, including the power to change the working title of any position or to 5 6 reorganize or rename any of the divisions, units, or functions 7 specified in this section. Any change of working title shall not alter the classification or compensation of any person in 8 9 the state Merit System.

10 Section 6. (a)(1) The Director of the Department of Public Safety shall be appointed by the Secretary of the 11 12 Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency, after consultation with 13 the Governor, and shall hold office at the pleasure of the 14 secretary. The salary of the director shall be set by the 15 secretary, and shall not be subject to Section 36-6-6, Code of Alabama 1975. A person appointed director shall have an 16 17 extensive law enforcement background and, by virtue of office, is a state law enforcement officer with the immunity set forth 18 in Section 6-5-338, Code of Alabama 1975. 19

(2) The director shall have overall supervision and 20 21 management of functions transferred to the department pursuant 22 to this section, subject to the approval of the secretary, 23 including the power to change the working title of any 24 position or to reorganize or rename any of the divisions, 25 units, or functions specified in this section. Any change of 26 working title shall not alter the classification or 27 compensation of any person in the state Merit System.

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(3) All functions performed by the department on
 October 1, 2014, shall remain under the Department of Public
 Safety unless reorganized by the secretary or otherwise
 transferred pursuant to this act.

5 (b) (1) The Highway Patrol Division of the Department 6 of Public Safety succeeds to and is vested with all law 7 enforcement functions of the following enforcement units, and 8 a reference in any law to these enforcement units shall be 9 deemed a reference to the Highway Patrol Division of the 10 Department of Public Safety:

a. The law enforcement unit of the Public ServiceCommission.

b. The revenue enforcement officers of theDepartment of Revenue.

15 (2) The director shall appoint a chief of the16 division.

(c) (1) The Marine Police Division is hereby created
within the Department of Public Safety. The director shall
appoint a chief of the division.

(2) The Marine Police Division of the Department of
Public Safety succeeds to and is vested with all functions of
the Marine Police Division of the Department of Conservation
and Natural Resources. A reference in any law to the Marine
Police Division of the Department of Conservation and Natural
Resources shall be deemed a reference to the Marine Police
Division of the Department of Public Safety.

Section 7. (a) For the purposes of this section, the term "legacy agency" means an existing agency, department, or division that is being reorganized or abolished under this act.

5 (b) Unless otherwise provided in this act, all 6 positions created by this act shall be in the classified 7 service of the state Merit System.

(c) All persons employed on the effective date of 8 this act with a legacy agency and transferred to the Alabama 9 State Law Enforcement Agency, Department of Public Safety, or 10 State Bureau of Investigations shall maintain his or her 11 12 classification and benefits under the legacy agency. A person 13 employed by a legacy agency on the effective date of this act 14 shall not receive a decrease in salary, benefits, or seniority 15 or otherwise receive a decrease in classification as a result of the transfer to the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency, 16 17 Department of Public Safety, or State Bureau of Investigations. 18

(d) Any future change in classification shall not
 result in any change in benefits an employee previously had at
 a legacy agency.

(e) An employee of a legacy agency transferred to
the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency, Department of Public
Safety, or State Bureau of Investigations under this act shall
remain in his or her current classification unless appointed
to the appropriate classification within the newly created
department according to state Merit System procedures.

(f) Any employee hired in the Alabama State Law
Enforcement Agency after January 1, 2015, who is certified by
the Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission
and performs law enforcement duties shall be considered a law
enforcement officer, as defined by Section 36-27-59(a) (3),
Code of Alabama 1975, but is not eligible for the benefits
specified in Section 36-26-35(d), Code of Alabama 1975.

8 Section 8. Any law enforcement officer employed by 9 the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency shall be entitled to 10 the immunity set forth in Section 6-5-338, Code of Alabama 11 1975.

12 Section 9. All books, records, supplies, funds, 13 equipment, and personnel of the units, departments, divisions, 14 and other state entities merged with another state entity or abolished and the functions of which are transferred to 15 another state agency by this act shall be transferred to the 16 17 succeeding department or state entity to the extent that the books, records, supplies, funds, equipment, and personnel are 18 19 related to the functions transferred to the succeeding 20 department or entity.

21 Section 10. The Code Commissioner shall conform 22 references in the Code of Alabama 1975, to the units, 23 departments, divisions, and other state entities included in 24 this act to reflect the changes required by this act. Code 25 changes shall be made at a time determined to be appropriate 26 by the Code Commissioner. Section 11. Sections 41-9-592 and 41-9-593, Code of
 Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

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"§41-9-592.

4 "The commission shall be composed of two sections. "The voting section will include: the Secretary of 5 6 the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency, the Attorney 7 General, the Chairman of the Board of Pardons and Paroles, the Commissioner of the Board of Corrections, the President of the 8 Alabama Sheriffs' Association, the Director of the Department 9 10 of Public Safety, the President of the Alabama Association of Chiefs of Police, the Director of the Alabama Law Enforcement 11 12 Planning Agency, the President of the District Attorney's 13 Association, the President of the Circuit Clerks' Association, 14 the Chief Justice of the Alabama Supreme Court, the President 15 of the Alabama Association of Intermediate Court Judges, the President of the Circuit Judges' Association, the Governor's 16 17 coordinator of Alabama Highway and Traffic Safety and the Director of the Data Systems Management Division of the 18 Alabama Department of Finance. 19

"The advisory section will include: the presiding 20 21 officer of the Alabama Senate, the Speaker of the Alabama House of Representatives, the President of the Association of 22 23 County Commissions of Alabama, the President of the Alabama 24 League of Municipalities, the Administrative Director of the 25 Courts and a citizen of the State of Alabama, to be appointed by the Governor. The member shall have authority to select a 26 27 designee based upon qualifications and with a view of

continuity of representation and attendance at the commission
 meetings.

3 "No person or individual shall continue to serve on 4 the commission when he no longer officially represents the 5 function or serves in the capacity enumerated in this section 6 as a member to which he was elected or appointed.

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"§41-9-593.

8 "The commission shall, upon its first meeting, elect 9 from its membership a chairman and a vice-chairman who shall 10 serve for a period of one year. The vice-chairman shall act in 11 the place of the chairman in his absence or disability. 12 <u>Commencing October 1, 2014, the Secretary of the Alabama State</u> 13 <u>Law Enforcement Agency shall serve as chairman of the</u> 14 <u>commission.</u>

"The commission shall meet at such times as 15 designated by the commission or by the chairman at the state 16 17 capital or at other places as is deemed necessary or convenient, but the chairman of the commission must call a 18 meeting four times a year at the state capital or main 19 20 location of the ACJIC in the months of January, April, July 21 and October. The chairman of the commission may also call a 22 special meeting of the commission at any time he deems it 23 advisable or necessary. A quorum shall be a simple majority of the voting commission membership or their designees and all 24 25 matters coming before the commission shall be voted on by the commission. 26

"The commission will keep or cause to be kept a
 record of all transactions discussed or voted on by the
 commission.

4 "Members of the commission and their designees shall
5 serve without compensation; except, that payment of their
6 expenses may be paid in accordance with the applicable state
7 travel regulations."

8 Section 12. All laws or parts of laws which conflict 9 with this act are repealed.

10 Section 13. Sections 1 and 2 of this act shall 11 become effective immediately following the passage and 12 approval of this act by the Governor, or its otherwise 13 becoming law. The remainder of this act shall become effective 14 on January 1, 2015, following the passage and approval of this 15 act by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
