8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, each member of the
9 Alabama National Guard may obtain a distinctive
10 license tag for a passenger vehicle if the retired
11 member pays the regular privilege or license tax
12 and ad valorem tax.

13 This bill would exempt members of the
14 Alabama National Guard from payment of ad valorem
15 taxes for a distinctive license tag.

21 To amend Section 32-6-111.1, Code of Alabama 1975;
22 to exempt members of the Alabama National Guard from payment
23 of ad valorem taxes for a National Guard distinctive license
24 tag.

25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

26 Section 1. Section 32-6-111.1, Code of Alabama 1975,
27 is amended to read as follows:

1 "§32-6-111.1.

2 "(a) Notwithstanding Sections 32-6-64, 32-6-65,
3 32-6-67, and 32-6-68, upon application to the judge of probate
4 or license commissioner, compliance with motor vehicle
5 registration and licensing laws, payment of regular fees
6 required by law for license tags or plates, unless exempt
7 under provisions of Alabama law, and payment of an additional
8 annual fee of fifty dollars (\$50), which shall not be
9 prorated, ~~members~~; however, there shall be no ad valorem tax
10 for the motor vehicle on which the tag or plates are to be
11 displayed. Each member of the Alabama National Guard or the
12 Alabama Air National Guard, including retirees, may be issued
13 personalized distinctive National Guard license plates with an
14 inscription as provided in subsection (a) of Section 32-6-150.

15 "(b) The plates shall expire on September 30, of
16 each year, but shall be subject to a grace period for renewal
17 until November 30, of the year.

18 "(c) The plates shall be designed by the Department
19 of Revenue in accordance with Section 32-6-110.

20 "(d) In consultation with the Adjutant General, a
21 National Guard personalized license plate may designate the
22 military rank, command, or unit of a member, which plates may
23 be reassigned from one member to another."

24 Section 2. This act shall become effective on
25 October 1, 2013.
