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8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, a license to sell or
9 serve alcoholic beverages may be issued to a
10 facility where gambling or the game of bingo is
11 played using electronic machines.

12 This bill would prohibit the issuance of a
13 license to sell or serve alcoholic beverages to a
14 facility where gambling or the game of bingo is
15 played using electronic machines.

16 This bill would provide that as of the date
17 of its approval by the Governor, or its otherwise
18 becoming law, each license to sell or serve
19 alcoholic beverages currently issued to a facility
20 where gambling or the game of bingo is played using
21 electronic machines shall be considered null and
22 void and of no effect as of the date that this act
23 becomes law.

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2 Relating to alcoholic beverages; to prohibit the
3 issuance of a license to sell or serve alcoholic beverages to
4 a facility where gambling or the game of bingo is played using
5 electronic machines; and to provide that as of the date of
6 this bill's approval by the Governor, or its otherwise
7 becoming law, each license to sell or serve alcoholic
8 beverages currently issued to a facility where gambling or the
9 game of bingo is played using electronic machines shall be
10 considered null and void and of no effect as of the date that
11 this act becomes law.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

13 Section 1. (a) Notwithstanding any provision of law,
14 a license to sell or serve alcoholic beverages may not be
15 issued or renewed by a person or other entity where any of the
16 following activities occur:

17 (1) Gambling as that term is defined in Section
18 13A-12-20, Code of Alabama 1975.

19 (2) Class II gaming or Class III gaming as those
20 terms are defined in 25 U.S.C. §2703.

21 (b) Each license to sell or serve alcoholic
22 beverages currently issued to a person or entity where
23 considered null and void and of no effect as of the date that
24 this act becomes law.

25 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
26 first day of the third month following its passage and
27 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
