22	Section 1. This act shall only apply to Montgomery
23	County.
24	Section 2. Except for the service of warrants of
25	arrest, the Montgomery County Commission, with concurrence of
26	the sheriff, may contract with or enter into contract or

agreement with a private, public, or governmental entity for the purpose of service of process.

Section 3. (a) In addition to all existing charges, fees, judgments, and costs of court, in the criminal division of the district and circuit courts of Montgomery County, an additional service of process fee of thirty dollars (\$30) per document for service or attempted service shall be imposed.

- (b) In addition to all existing charges, fees, judgments, and costs of court, in the civil division of the district and circuit courts of Montgomery County, an additional service of process fee of thirty dollars (\$30) for service or attempted service per document shall be imposed.
- (c) The court official designated in Montgomery
 County by law for the respective courts shall collect the
 service of process fee designated in subsections (a) and (b)
 and shall remit the fees collected to the Montgomery County
 Commission to be deposited in the county general fund.
 Notwithstanding the foregoing, the fee shall not be imposed
 and collected if the court finds payment of the fee will
 create a substantial hardship. A verified statement signed by
 the person requesting service and approved by the court
 attesting the substantial hardship shall be filed with the
 clerk of the court.
- (d) The district attorney, law enforcement, and grand juries shall be exempt from payment of the fees provided in this act.

Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
