27	Deputy Commander; and

1 WHEREAS, he graduated from a number of United States 2 Army and Defense Schools including the National Defense College and the prestigious Project Management Course at the 3 Defense Systems Management College; while in service, he also completed two Master's Degrees and a Doctorate in Management 5 and Public Administration, and he served as Project Manager 6 7 for developing systems in the Army; and WHEREAS, following his military service, Dr. 8 9 Williams founded, operated, and then sold a communications 10 company, then a securities broker/dealer firm, and 11 subsequently embarked upon a career in consulting with the 12 defense industry and business community; and 13 WHEREAS, he served as the Finance Director for the 14 State of Alabama, 1995-1996, a Trustee at the University of 15 North Alabama, and a Director of the UNA Foundation; and WHEREAS, among his roles of civic leadership, Dr. 16 17 Williams held numerous key positions with the Rotary Club at the local, state, national, and international levels; and 18 19 WHEREAS, devoted to family and faith, he was actively involved in Whitesburg Baptist Church in Huntsville; 20 21 and 22 WHEREAS, he is survived by his wife of 25 years, 23 Ramsey Williams; sons, State Senator Phillip W.
