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8	CREATING THE ALABAMA BICENTENNIAL COMMISSION.
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10	WHEREAS, the year 2019 marks the two hundredth
11	anniversary of the attainment of statehood by Alabama upon its
12	admission by Congress as the twenty-first state in the Union;
13	and
14	WHEREAS, as the state approaches its bicentennial
15	year of statehood, it is appropriate to celebrate and
16	commemorate this anniversary through local and statewide
17	observances and activities planned, encouraged, coordinated,
18	and conducted by a commission created for such purpose; and
19	WHEREAS, during the summer of 1819, 44 delegates met
20	in the City of Huntsville to debate and author Alabama's first
21	constitution. Specifically, these delegates met at what is now
22	known as Alabama Constitution Village and their efforts
23	enabled Alabama's admittance to the Union; now therefore,
24	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
25	HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Alabama Bicentennial
26	Commission is created and established for the purpose of

leading the state in its bicentennial commemoration of attaining statehood.

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- 3 (a) The purpose and agenda of the commission shall include the following:
 - (1) Plan and develop activities appropriate to commemorate the bicentennial anniversary of Alabama's statehood, including projects seeking to harmonize and balance the important goals of ceremony and celebration with the equally important goals of scholarship, education, and economic development.
 - (2) Encourage private organizations and local governments to organize and participate in bicentennial activities commemorating and examining the historic events associated with Alabama's statehood.
 - (3) Serve as a clearinghouse for collecting and disseminating information about bicentennial events and plans in the state.
 - (4) Cooperate and coordinate with any similar commission created by the United States government or any other state in preparing to commemorate and celebrate this important historical event.
 - (5) Encourage state agencies to develop bicentennial programs such as the creation of commemorative automobile license plates and public programs in state and local parks, museums, and libraries.
 - (6) Seek cooperation, advice, and assistance from both private and governmental agencies and organizations,

- including local governments, scholarly societies, academic institutions, and historical, patriotic, philanthropic, civic,
- 3 and professional groups and associations.
- 4 (7) Adopt rules and regulations regarding the use of logos, symbols, or marks, or any facsimile thereof, originated under the authority of and certified by the commission for use in connection with the state bicentennial commemoration.
- 8 (b)(1) The commission shall consist of the following 9 members:
 - a. Two members appointed by the Governor.
 - b. Two members appointed by the Lieutenant Governor.
- 12 c. Two members appointed by the President Pro
- 13 Tempore of the Senate.

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- d. Two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representative.
- e. The Director of the Alabama Tourism Department or his or her designee.
- f. The Director of the Department of Archives and
 History or his or her designee.
- g. The Director of the Alabama Constitution Village or his or her designee.
- h. The Director the State Black Archives Center and
 Museum or his or her designee.
- 24 (2) Each member shall serve at the pleasure of his 25 or her appointing authority.
- 26 (3) A vacancy in the membership shall be filled in 27 the same manner as the original appointment.

(c) The members of the commission shall elect a chair, vice-chair, and other officers and may employ such staff as deemed necessary for the efficient operation of the business of the commission.

- (d) The members of the commission shall serve without compensation; however, they shall be reimbursed for actual expenses, including travel expenses, to the extent that funds are made available for that purpose. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no legislative member shall receive additional per diem when the Legislature is in session or if a legislative member is being paid any other payments on the same dates for attendance on other state business.
- (e) The commission shall hold its initial meeting no later than September 1, 2013, and shall meet thereafter according to a schedule established by the members. Special meetings shall be held on the call of the chair or a quorum of the members of the commission. The chair or other members of the commission calling the meeting shall give at least seven days' notice of all regular or special meetings, which notice shall include the place and the time of the meeting. A majority of the members of the commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of all business at a regular or special meeting.
- (f) The commission shall submit an annual report to the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the President Pro
 Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of
 Representatives no later than 30 days prior to the beginning

- of the regular session of the Legislature in 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2019. The report shall include specific recommendations and plans for commemoration and coordinating
- (g) Each department, commission, board, agency,

 officer, and institution of the state and all subdivisions of

 the state shall cooperate with the commission in carrying out

 the purposes of this act.
- 9 (h) The Alabama Bicentennial Commission shall 10 terminate on April 30, 2020.
