9	PUBLIC AWARENESS OF RISKS OF NONVALVULAR ATRIAL FIBRILLATION.
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11	WHEREAS, atrial fibrillation (AF), the most common
12	type of irregular heartbeat, consists of two types,
13	nonvalvular AF (NVAF) and valvular AF; and
14	WHEREAS, NVAF makes up approximately 95 percent of
15	AF, affecting an estimated 5.8 million people in the U.S.; and
16	WHEREAS, individuals with NVAF have five times
17	greater risk of stroke, and about 15 percent of strokes are
18	due to NVAF; and
19	WHEREAS, stroke is the fourth leading cause of death
20	as well as a leading cause of long-term disability in the
21	U.S., accounting for 1 in every 19 deaths in 2009; and
22	WHEREAS, in 2010, the total cost of cardiovascular
23	diseases in the U.S. was estimated at \$444 billion, and
24	treatment of these diseases accounts for about \$1 of every \$6
25	spent on health care in this country; and

WHEREAS, as of 2005, NVAF alone cost an estimated 1 2 \$6.65 billion per year, with nearly 75 percent of those direct and indirect costs associated with hospitalization; and 3 WHEREAS, NVAF is a serious health issue deserving attention from state health officials; an increase in 5 6 community awareness of NVAF can improve the likelihood that 7 people with NVAF will seek the treatment they need before suffering from devastating consequences; now therefore, 8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 9 10 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That in order to improve public health and ultimately save taxpayer dollars, we hereby urge 11 12 the Department of Public Health to increase public awareness 13 of the risks posed by nonvalvular atrial fibrillation and

stroke and the availability of treatment options.

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
