9		Insurance is authorized to collect fingerprints and

25		TO BE ENTITLED
26		AN ACT
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To amend Sections 27-7-4.4, 27-9A-17, and 27-25-4.6, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the licensing by the Department of Insurance, insurance producers, title insurance agents, and independent adjusters, and authorizing the Commissioner of Insurance to require the submission of fingerprints for the purpose of criminal background checks; to delete all reference to submitting and storing the electronic fingerprint records with the National Association of Insurance Commissioners for retention in a centralized repository and to provide an exception for limited lines producers.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Sections 27-7-4.4, 27-9A-17, and 27-25-4.6, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

"\$27-7-4.4.

"(a) In order to make a determination of insurance producer license eligibility, the commissioner is authorized to require fingerprints of initial resident applicants for an insurance producer license and to submit the fingerprints and the fee required to perform the criminal history record checks to the Alabama Department of Public Safety and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) for state and national criminal history record checks.

"(b) The commissioner shall require a criminal history record check on each initial resident applicant for insurance producer license in accordance with this section.

The commissioner shall require each applicant to submit a full

set of fingerprints, including a scanned file from a hard copy fingerprint, in order for the commissioner to obtain and receive national criminal history records from the FBI Criminal Justice Information Services Division.

"(c) The commissioner may contract for the collection, transmission, and resubmission of fingerprints required under this section. If the commissioner does so, the fee for collecting, transmitting, and retaining fingerprints shall be payable directly to the contractor by the applicant. The commissioner may agree to a reasonable fingerprinting fee to be charged by the contractor and both the contractor's fee and the fee required to perform the criminal history check shall be collected from the applicant by the contractor.

"(d) The commissioner may waive submission of fingerprints by any person who has previously furnished fingerprints and those fingerprints are on file with the centralized repository of the NAIC.

"(e)(d) The commissioner is authorized to receive criminal history record information in lieu of the Alabama

Department of Public Safety that submitted the fingerprints to the FBI.

"(f) The commissioner is authorized to submit
electronic fingerprint records and necessary identifying
information to the NAIC for permanent retention in a
centralized repository. The purpose of such a centralized
repository is to provide insurance commissioners with access

to fingerprint records in order to perform criminal history record checks.

"(g)(e) The commissioner shall treat and maintain an applicant's fingerprints and any criminal history record information obtained under this section as confidential and shall apply security measures consistent with the Criminal Justice Information Services Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation standards for the electronic storage of fingerprints and necessary identifying information and limit the use of records solely to the purposes authorized in this section. The fingerprints and any criminal history record information shall not be subject to subpoena, other than one issued in a criminal action or investigation, and shall be confidential.

"(h)(f) As used in this section, initial resident applicant means an initial home state license and an additional line of authority under an existing home state license where a criminal history record check has not been obtained.

"(q) This section shall not apply to limited lines producers.

"(i) (h) The commissioner may promulgate reasonable regulations as are necessary or proper to carry out the purposes of this section in accordance with Chapter 2 of this title. The commissioner may by regulation provide for the delayed enforcement of this section for up to 24 months

following January 1, 2013, the effective date of the act amending this subsection to allow for implementation.

3 "\$27-9A-17.

- "(a) In order to make a determination of license eligibility, the commissioner may require fingerprints of applicants and to submit the fingerprints and the fee required to perform the criminal history record checks to the Alabama Department of Public Safety and the Federal Bureau of Investigation for state and national criminal history record checks.
- "(b) The commissioner may require a criminal history record check on each applicant in accordance with this section. The commissioner shall require each applicant to submit a full set of fingerprints, including a scanned file from a hard copy fingerprint, in order for the commissioner to obtain and receive national criminal history records from the Criminal Justice Information Services Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. In the case of business entity applicants, the commissioner shall require the submission of fingerprints of all of the following:
- "(1) All executive officers and directors of the applicant.
- "(2) Any individual owning, directly or indirectly,
 51 percent or more of the outstanding voting securities of the
 applicant.

"(3) All executive officers and directors of entities owning 51 percent or more of the outstanding voting securities of the applicant.

- "(c) The commissioner may contract for the collection, transmission, and resubmission of fingerprints required under this section. If the commissioner does so, the fee for collecting, transmitting, and retaining fingerprints shall be payable directly to the contractor by the person. The commissioner may agree to a reasonable fingerprinting fee to be charged by the contractor.
- "(d) The commissioner may waive submission of fingerprints by any person that has previously furnished fingerprints and those fingerprints are on file with the centralized repository of the NAIC.
- "(e)(d) The commissioner may receive criminal history record information from the Federal Bureau of Investigation in lieu of the information being submitted to the Alabama Department of Public Safety.
- "(f) The commissioner may submit electronic fingerprint records and necessary identifying information to the NAIC for permanent retention in a centralized repository. The purpose of such a centralized repository is to provide insurance commissioners with access to fingerprint records in order to perform criminal history record checks.
- "(g)(e) The commissioner shall treat and maintain an applicant's fingerprints and any criminal history record information obtained under this section as confidential and

shall apply security measures consistent with the Criminal Justice Information Services Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation standards for the electronic storage of fingerprints and necessary identifying information and limit the use of records solely to the purposes authorized in this section. The fingerprints and any criminal history record information shall not be subject to subpoena, other than one issued in a criminal action or investigation, and shall be confidential.

"(f) The commissioner, by regulation, may provide for the delayed enforcement of this section for up to 24 months following the effective date of the act adding this subsection to allow for implementation.

"\$27-25-4.6.

- "(a) In order to make a determination of title insurance agent license eligibility, the commissioner may require fingerprints of initial applicants for a title insurance agent license, and the fingerprints and the fee required to perform the criminal history record checks shall be submitted to the Alabama Department of Public Safety and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) for state and national criminal history record checks.
- "(b) The commissioner shall require a criminal history record check on each initial applicant for title insurance agent license pursuant to this section. The commissioner shall require each applicant to submit a full set of fingerprints, including a scanned file from a hard copy

fingerprint, to allow the commissioner to obtain and receive national criminal history records from the FBI Criminal Justice Information Services Division.

"(c) The commissioner may contract for the collection, transmission, and resubmission of fingerprints required pursuant to this section, and the fee for collecting, transmitting, and retaining fingerprints shall be payable directly to the contractor by the applicant. The commissioner may agree to a reasonable fingerprinting fee to be charged by the contractor, and both the contractor's fee and the fee required to perform the criminal history check shall be collected from the applicant by the contractor.

"(d) The commissioner may waive submission of fingerprints by any person that has previously furnished fingerprints and those fingerprints are on file with the centralized repository of the NAIC.

"(e)(d) The criminal history record information may be submitted to the commissioner instead of the Alabama Department of Public Safety.

"(f) The commissioner may submit electronic fingerprint records and necessary identifying information to the NAIC for permanent retention in a centralized repository. The purpose of a centralized repository is to provide insurance commissioners with access to fingerprint records to perform criminal history record checks.

"(g)(e) The commissioner shall treat and maintain an applicant's fingerprints and any criminal history record

information obtained pursuant to this section as confidential and shall apply security measures consistent with the Criminal Justice Information Services Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation standards for the electronic storage of fingerprints and necessary identifying information and limit the use of records solely to the purposes authorized in this section. The fingerprints and any criminal history record information shall not be subject to subpoena, other than one issued in a criminal action or investigation, and shall be confidential.

"(f) The commissioner, by regulation, may provide
for the delayed enforcement of this section for up to 24
months from the effective date of the act adding this
subsection to allow for delayed implementation."

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
