12	system filter replacement, duct cleaning, and

14	This bill would also provide for classroom
15	training for home builders through the nonprofit
16	Alabama Home Builders Foundation.

19	TO BE ENTITLED
20	AN ACT
21	
22	To amend Sections 34-31-18, 34-31-20, 34-31-21,
23	34-31-24, and 34-31-25, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the
24	regulation of heating and air conditioning contractors, to
25	include the regulation of the practices of duct cleaning,
26	checking duct tightness, and filter replacement by the Board
27	of Heating, Air Conditioning, and Refrigeration Contractors;

1	and to provide for the definition of terms, fees, and training
2	requirements for such practices; and to provide for classroom
3	training for home builders through the nonprofit Alabama Home
4	Builders Foundation.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
6	Section 1. Sections 34-31-18, 34-31-20, 34-31-21,
7	34-31-24, and 34-31-25, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to
8	read as follows:
9	"§34-31-18.
10	"For the purposes of this chapter, the following
11	terms shall have the meanings herein ascribed to them unless
12	the context clearly indicates otherwise:
13	"(1) ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE LAW. Sections 41-22-1
14	through 41-22-27, and any subsequent amendment or supplement
15	thereto, and any rules or regulations promulgated thereto.
16	"(2) APPRENTICE. A person other than a certified
17	heating, air conditioning, or refrigeration contractor, who is
18	engaged in learning and assisting in the installation,
19	service, or repair of a heating, air conditioning, or
20	refrigeration system and working under the direct supervision
21	of a certified heating, air conditioning, or refrigeration
22	contractor, and who has successfully fulfilled the voluntary
23	registration requirements of the board and has been duly
24	registered by the board as such for the current year.
25	"(3) BOARD. The State Board of Heating, Air
26	Conditioning, and Refrigeration Contractors, herein
27	established.

1 "(4) CERTIFICATION. The process of testing to 2 determine the knowledge and skill of an individual with 3 respect to heating, air conditioning, and refrigeration. This 4 term is used herein interchangeably with the term "license."

5 "(5) CERTIFIED FILTER REPLACEMENT AND DUCT CLEANING 6 <u>CONTRACTOR. Any and all legal entities engaged in the business</u> 7 of filter replacement, duct cleaning, or both.

8 "(5)(6) CERTIFIED HEATING AND AIR CONDITIONING 9 CONTRACTOR. Any individual or any regularly employed person 10 for any partnership or corporation who for hire is engaged in 11 the installation or service and repair of heating and air 12 conditioning systems. Any and all legal entities engaged in 13 the business of heating and air conditioning contracting and 14 installation or service and repair.

15 "(6)(7) CERTIFIED REFRIGERATION CONTRACTOR. Any and 16 all legal entities engaged in the business of refrigeration 17 contracting and servicing, installation, and repair.

"(8) DUCT AIR TIGHTNESS TESTING CONTRACTOR. Any
 individual who engages in the practice of testing and
 verifying duct air tightness in conjunction with the
 installation, service, or repair of a heating and air
 conditioning system.
 "(9) DUCT CLEANING. The act of mechanical cleaning
 or physical removal of debris and other foreign matter from a

25 <u>duct system attached to a heating and air conditioning system.</u>

1 "(10) FILTER REPLACEMENT. The act of installing or 2 removing air filters from a heating and air conditioning or 3 refrigeration system.

"(7)(11) HEATING AND AIR CONDITIONING SYSTEMS OR
SYSTEM. A heating and/or cooling apparatus consisting of an
air heating and/or cooling fixture from pipes, plenums, or
blowers including any accessory and equipment installed in
connection herewith; specifically excluding window units,
automotive, or farm implement type heating and/or air
conditioning equipment.

11 "(8)(12) INSTALLATION. The act of setting up or 12 installing a heating and air conditioning system or 13 refrigeration system for operation and use.

14 "(9)(13) REFRIGERATION. The use of mechanical or 15 absorption equipment to control temperature, humidity, or 16 both, in order to satisfy the intended use of a specific 17 space, other than for human comfort.

18 "(10)(14) REFRIGERATION TRADE OR BUSINESS. Includes 19 any and all legal entities engaged in the installation, 20 maintenance, servicing, and repairing of refrigerating 21 machinery, equipment, devices, and components.

"(11)(15) REGULARLY EMPLOYED PERSON. A person who is an actual employee of the business, not an independent contractor. The person must work an average of 30 or more hours per week for the heating, air conditioning, or refrigeration business. A regularly employed person must not be paid as an independent contractor and must receive a W-2
 for all earnings.

3 "(12)(16) RESPONSIBLE CHARGE. The direction of 4 projects involving the installation or service and repair of 5 heating, air conditioning, and refrigeration systems requiring 6 initiation, professional skills, technical knowledge, and 7 independent judgment.

8 "(13)(17) SERVICE AND REPAIR. The act of maintaining 9 for operation a heating, air conditioning, or refrigeration 10 system which has previously been installed including parts 11 replacement within a piece of equipment.

"§34-31-20.

"(a) The Board of Heating and Air Conditioning
Contractors as created by Act 82-547, 1982 Regular Session
(Acts 1982, p. 900), is renamed the Board of Heating, Air
Conditioning, and Refrigeration Contractors. The authority of
the board is expanded to allow the board to examine, certify,
and regulate heating, air conditioning, and refrigeration on a
statewide basis.

"(b) The board shall consist of 12 members, who 20 21 shall be citizens of this state and who shall be subject to 22 confirmation by the Senate. The seven initial appointments shall be effective as of July 1, 1982, as follows: One member 23 24 shall be appointed by the Governor for an initial term of one 25 year, and shall be a licensed professional engineer; one 26 member shall be appointed by the Governor for an initial term 27 of four years and shall be a heating and air conditioning

1 contractor; one member shall be appointed by the Lieutenant 2 Governor for an initial term of three years and shall be a trade representative of an equipment manufacturer or supplier; 3 4 one member shall be appointed by the Governor for an initial term of three years and shall be a consumer from the general 5 6 public; one member shall be appointed by the Speaker of the 7 House of Representatives for an initial term of two years and shall be a trade representative of the service, repair parts 8 9 industry; one member shall be appointed by the Lieutenant 10 Governor for an initial term of two years, and shall be a representative from county or local inspection services 11 12 department; and one member shall be appointed by the Speaker 13 of the House of Representatives for an initial term of three 14 years, and shall be a consumer from the general public. Three 15 additional members shall be appointed to serve four-year terms beginning on January 1, 2001. Each of these three additional 16 17 members shall be heating and air conditioning contractors. One of these additional members shall be appointed by the 18 Governor, one of these additional members shall be appointed 19 by the Lieutenant Governor, and one of these additional 20 21 members shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the 22 Senate. An additional two members, who shall be heating and 23 air conditioning contractors, shall be appointed by the 24 Speaker of the House of Representatives for initial terms of 25 three years. Their successors, who shall be appointed by the 26 same respective appointing authorities, and shall possess the 27 same respective occupational qualifications, shall each serve

not more than two consecutive terms of office of four years
 each and until their successors are appointed and qualified.
 The membership of the board shall be inclusive and reflect the
 racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and economic
 diversity of the state.

6 "(c) All moneys, equipment, and property of the 7 board created pursuant to Sections 34-31-1 through 34-31-17, inclusive, shall, effective July 1, 1982, be transferred to 8 the board created in subsection (a). The board shall pay all 9 10 money received under this chapter to the State Treasurer, who shall keep the money in a separate fund for the board. All 11 12 money remaining at the end of the fiscal year which exceeds 25 13 percent of the board's budget for the previous year shall be 14 transferred to the State General Fund 501(c)(3) nonprofit 15 Alabama Home Builders Foundation to be used exclusively for classroom training tools at educational facilities that 16 17 provide heating, air conditioning and/or refrigeration curriculums to include any program approved or accredited by 18 the State of Alabama, United States federal government, or any 19 20 state or federal governmental agency or board. If, at any 21 time, the Alabama Home Builders Foundation should lose its 22 nonprofit status, those funds shall be transferred to the 23 State General Fund.

24 "\$34-31-21.

"(a) The board shall elect from among its members a
chairman, vice-chairman, and a secretary. The board may hire
an executive director to serve at the pleasure of the board.

1 The board may require the executive director to perform the 2 duties required by this section and any other tasks required by the board. The board shall set the salary of the executive 3 4 director. The executive director, with the consent of the 5 board, may employ a deputy director who shall serve at the 6 pleasure of the board executive director. The salary and 7 compensation for the deputy director shall be set by the board and shall not exceed the salary set for the executive 8 9 director.

10 "(b) The chairman shall preside over meetings of the 11 board. The vice-chairman shall preside over meetings of the 12 board in the absence of the chairman. The chairman shall 13 designate another member to preside in the absence of the 14 chairman and vice-chairman.

15 "(c) The secretary or, if directed by the board, the16 executive director shall perform the following tasks:

17 "(1) Keep all minutes, books, records, and files of18 the board.

19 "(2) Issue all certificates in the name of the20 board.

"(3) Send all notices and attend to allcorrespondence directed by the board.

"(4) Receive and deposit all fees.

24 "(5) Perform all incidental duties of the office as25 directed by the board.

26 "(d) The secretary shall give bond, payable to the27 Governor, in the penal sum of \$5,000 for the faithful

performance of his or her duties, and the premium therefor
 shall be paid from the fees of the board.

3 "(e) No moneys shall be withdrawn from the funds of 4 the board except by direction of the board as provided by 5 state law.

6 "(f) A majority of the board shall constitute a 7 quorum for the transaction of all business.

8 "(g) The board is also authorized to adopt and 9 publish minimum repair and service standards for its certified 10 contractors, and shall mail a copy thereof to every certified 11 contractor at least 30 days before the standard of criteria 12 becomes effective. Certified contractors who fail to comply 13 with such minimum standards and criteria shall be punished as 14 prescribed in Section 34-31-32(a).

"(h) The board is authorized to hold hearings, call
witnesses, administer oaths, take testimony, and obtain
evidence in the conduct of its business. It is further
authorized to take such disciplinary actions as are authorized
in subsection (c) of Section 34-31-32.

"(i) The board is authorized to expend funds for
 purposes of public awareness of the board and its rules and
 regulations to include advertising, promotional materials,
 event exhibiting, or other means approved by the board.

"§34-31-24.

"(a) (1) No individual, partnership, or corporation
 shall advertise, solicit, bid, obtain permit, do business, or
 perform the function of a certified contractor unless the

person or persons in responsible charge, as defined in Section
 34-31-18(12), are certified contractors.

3 "(b)(2) Every contractor licensed under this chapter
4 shall display the contractor's certification number and the
5 company name on any and all documentation, forms of
6 advertising, and on all service and installation vehicles used
7 in conjunction with heating, air conditioning, and
8 refrigeration contracting.

9 "(c)(3) A contractor licensed under this chapter may
 10 not permit the use of his or her license by any other persons.

"(d)(4) No official charged with the duty of issuing licenses to any individual, partnership, or corporation to operate a business as a certified contractor shall issue such license unless there is presented for inspection a certificate of qualification as provided for herein issued by the board to the individual or to some person in responsible charge with the partnership or corporation.

"(b) The following requirements apply to the 18 practice of testing or verifying duct air tightness: 19 "(1) Any individual who engages in the practice of 20 21 testing and verifying duct air tightness is required to 22 register with the board. Such individuals shall not be 23 required to become a certified heating and air conditioning 24 contractor, but shall complete training as set forth by this 25 subsection. The board shall maintain a list of individuals who 26 are registered duct envelope testing contractors in the 27 practice of testing and verifying duct air tightness and

1	leakage. The board may establish fees to be paid by
2	registrants. All fees must accompany the application for
3	registration and are nonrefundable. All registrations must be
4	renewed by December 31 of each year beginning in 2013. The
5	board may establish a late fee for those individuals failing
6	to renew December 31.
7	"(2) Any board certified heating and air
8	conditioning contractor or home builder licensed by the
9	Alabama Home Builders Licensure Board, seeking to register as
10	a duct tightness tester for the purposes of testing ducts on
11	his or her own project or on a third party basis for the
12	general public, must successfully complete the Residential
13	Energy Services Network Home Energy Rating Systems (HERS)
14	Rater training, the Building Performance Institute Building
15	Analyst (BPI) training, or the Home Builders Association of
16	Alabama Qualified Credentialed Air Tightness Verifier (QCATV)
17	training. Any applicant that is not a board certified
18	contractor or a licensed home builder seeking to register as a
19	duct tightness tester for the purposes of testing duct work on
20	a third party basis for the general public, must successfully
21	complete the Residential Energy Services Network Home Energy
22	Rating System (HERS) Rater training or the Building
23	Performance Institute Building Analyst (BPI) training. Each
24	applicant must submit verification that he or she has
25	successfully completed the training required by at least one
26	of the above listed programs to the board prior to receiving
27	the registration in order to be added to the list of

registered individuals. Each registrant must submit completion 1 2 of subsequent annual training provided by the training program 3 he or she used to receive his or her initial registration 4 prior to annual re-registration by the board. "(3) The board may discipline any registrant who 5 6 fails to conduct air tightness testing to the standards set 7 forth by the board. Discipline for registrants may include any and all penalties authorized by this chapter. 8 "(c)(1) On and after the effective date of the act 9 10 adding this language, any and all legal entities that engage in the business of filter replacement or duct cleaning must 11 12 submit an application and appropriate fees established by the 13 board to the board in order to receive a Filter Replacement 14 and Duct Cleaning Contractor Certification. Such contractors 15 shall not be required to become a certified heating and air conditioning contractor, but shall be required to meet a 16 17 minimum of four hours of board-approved training on filter replacement, duct cleaning, and basic system maintenance. In 18 order to be considered for approved training, the curriculum 19 requirements shall consist of basics of air quality, air 20 21 tightness, and proper filter installation in common systems. 22 All fees must accompany the application for registration or registration renewal and are nonrefundable. All registrations 23 must be renewed annually. The board may establish a late fee 24 25 for those individuals failing to renew by November 30. 26 "(2) The board may discipline any registrant who 27 fails to conduct filter changing and/or duct cleaning to the

1 <u>standards set forth by the board. Discipline for registrants</u>

2 <u>may include any penalty authorized by this chapter on a</u>

3 <u>licensed contractor</u>.

"§34-31-25.

"(a)(1) For the purpose of defraying the expense in 5 carrying out the provisions of this chapter, the board may fix 6 7 fees to be paid by applicants for certificates for the issuance, reissuance, and replacement of certificates and for 8 any other service provided by the board, but in no event shall 9 10 the charges fixed by the board exceed two hundred dollars (\$200). The inactive fees may be waived for building officials 11 12 or inspectors, as defined by the International Code Council. 13 All fees fixed by the board must accompany the application, and no part of the fees shall be refunded. The fees shall be 14 15 received by the board and held solely for the purpose of paying the expense of carrying out the provisions of this 16 17 chapter.

18 "(2) Renewal fees shall be established by the board 19 as to insure adequate funding to support the board. Fees shall 20 not exceed two hundred dollars (\$200) per year. The amount of 21 these fees shall be established by the board on an annual 22 basis to provide adequate funding to support the board and to 23 pay the expenses incurred for applications, examinations, 24 and/or renewals of licenses.

"(b) Fees for apprentice registration and annual
renewal fees shall not exceed fifty dollars (\$50).

1	"(c) Fees for Filter Replacement and Duct Cleaning
2	Contractors application and annual renewal shall not exceed
3	one hundred dollars (\$100).

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
