23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. The monies in Section 2 are appropriated
25	from the named funds for the 2014-2015 fiscal year to the
26	state agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the
27	expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all

monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of
 the Alabama Statutes.

For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the following definitions shall be applicable.

9 "Appropriation Total" shall mean the aggregate total 10 of all fund sources.

"Program" shall mean specific governmental services required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

16 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which 17 result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as 18 land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable 19 period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be 20 expended only for such purposes.

"Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

24 "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts,
25 grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by
26 the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

1 Section 2. There is hereby appropriated 2 the amounts set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, 3 4 for other functions of government, for debt service, and for capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2015, 5 to be paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such 6 7 other funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as may be necessary, and the total amount to be ex-8 9 pended for the items for which the appropriation is herein 10 made shall not exceed the amount provided therefor, except as 11 provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 12 41-19-1 through 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, how-13 ever, that regardless of the ending date of any pay period 14 which has been or may be established by the Legislature for 15 the payment of salaries of state employees, the entire payment due shall be made from the fiscal year's appropriation in 16 17 which the pay date falls.

In addition to the amounts otherwise 18 appropriated in this act, there is hereby conditionally 19 appropriated from the several funds in the State Treasury and 20 in the same proportion as the salaries of the several State officials and employees are paid, such additional amounts as 21 22 may be necessary to pay for a salary increase of up to 4 23 percent (4%) enacted in the 2014 Regular Session. 1 Section 8. Any surplus remaining in any 2 appropriation herein made from the State General Fund to any office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency may be 3 4 transferred, on order of the Governor, to any other appropriation herein made from the State General Fund when 5 6 such appropriation to any office, department, bureau, board, 7 commission or agency is insufficient to pay salaries in that office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency. 8

Section 9. In addition to appropriations herein 9 10 made, all gifts, grants, insurance proceeds, contributions or entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in the bill, 11 12 including grants by the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties, to any department, division, 13 14 board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or 15 officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and, 16 in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to 17 such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or officer to be used only for the purpose 18 or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or shall 19 be made. Further, all state, county, municipal and educational 20 21 entities are authorized to disburse such sums as deemed 22 necessary by mutual agreement between said entities and the 23 State of Alabama, Department of Examiners of Public Accounts 24 to partially defray the cost of auditing services performed by 25 said agency. All such sums are hereby appropriated and 26 reappropriated if necessary to the Department of Examiners of

Public Accounts for audit services, to be expended through the
 fund established by Section 41-5-24, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 10. The Department of Examiners of Public 3 4 Accounts is hereby authorized to examine as deemed necessary all appropriations herein made for compliance with the laws of 5 6 the State of Alabama. Any examination performed shall be in 7 accordance with the provisions of Title 41, Chapter 5, Code of Alabama 1975. It is the intent of the Legislature that all 8 state agencies cooperate with the Examiners of Public Accounts 9 10 to provide the information necessary to conduct recovery audits as provided for in Section 41-5-6.1, Code of Alabama 11 12 1975.

13 Section 11. Upon certification to the Director of 14 Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has 15 ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby 16 17 appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such 18 department, board, bureau or commission in the amount 19 20 necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are 21 in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter 22 made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are 23 conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination 24 by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are 25 not available for the court-ordered payments.

26 Section 12. All interest earned from funds paid into 27 Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act 90-556 and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the
Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of
the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from
Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal
Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd
Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are
hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.

Section 13. All encumbered balances of a previous 8 9 fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions 10 authorized by this Act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal 11 12 year immediately following the fiscal year for which the 13 appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the 14 15 appropriation or appropriations were made.

16 Section 14. The appropriations made herein to the 17 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include the amounts necessary and said departments, boards, offices, 18 commissions and agencies are hereby directed to make the 19 transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in said 20 21 amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated in 22 this act and receiving services from other governmental 23 agencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a 24 timely manner (as determined by the Department of Finance) for such services. 25

26 Section 15. All funds collected under Section 27 40-12-43.1 between the effective date of Act 98-191 and September 30, 2014 are hereby appropriated to the Auburn
 University Center for Governmental Services for the
 administration of the examiner certification program
 established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards
 and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1.

6 Section 16. It is the intent of the Legislature that 7 the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President Pro Tempore in subsection 9 of Section 2A of this act which 8 9 are not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate 10 President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized 11 for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code 12 of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of 13 Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama 1975. 14

Section 17. The appropriations made herein to the 15 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 16 17 the amounts necessary to pay the State Employees' Insurance Board (SEIB). The SEIB rate shall be \$825 per month for each 18 full-time employee for the fiscal year ending September 30, 19 2015. The State Employees' Insurance Board will adjust the 20 21 insurance program wherever appropriate to maintain the aforementioned fixed rate. 22

23 Section 18. It is the intent of the Legislature that 24 the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House 25 Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate 26 Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the 27 Legislative Fiscal Officer of any interagency transfers, of any type, including contracting, of any of the funds
 appropriated in this act.

3 Section 19. If any section, paragraph, sentence, 4 clause, provision or portion of this act or all or any portion 5 of any appropriations herein made be held unconstitutional or 6 invalid, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, 7 sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or any 8 other appropriation or appropriations or portion thereof 9 hereby made not in and of itself unconstitutional or invalid.

10 Section 20. All laws or parts of laws, general, 11 special, private or local that are in conflict with or 12 inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby 13 expressly repealed.

14 Section 21. Each agency of the State funded through 15 the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity 16 for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of 17 this state without regard to sex or race.

Section 22. This act shall become effective October 1, 2014.
