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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 32-6-1.2, Code of Alabama 1975,
is amended to read as follows:

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"§32-6-1.2.

5 "(a) The driver's license of a resident of this 6 state who is an honorably discharged veteran as evidenced by 7 the veteran's DD Form 214, <u>or if the veteran does not have a</u> 8 <u>DD Form 214, as evidenced by the veteran's Record and Report</u> 9 <u>of Separation Honorable Discharge Record,</u> upon request of the 10 eligible veteran, shall have the word veteran displayed on the 11 license.

12 "(b) The Department of Public Safety may not impose 13 any charge in addition to the driver's license fee for the 14 issuance or renewal of a veteran's driver's license."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
