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8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, a veteran who is a
9 resident of the state and is honorably discharged
10 as evidenced by a DD Form 214 is eligible to
11 receive a driver's license with the term veteran
12 displayed on the license.

13 This bill would provide that where the
14 veteran does not have the DD Form 214, the veteran
15 could submit a Veteran's Record and Report of
16 Separation Honorable Discharge Record in order to
17 meet the eligibility requirements for a veteran's
18 driver's license.

24 To amend Section 32-6-1.2, Code of Alabama 1975,
25 relating to veteran's driver's licenses; to provide that
26 certain veterans may submit the veteran's Record and Report of
27 Separation Honorable Discharge Record to prove eligibility.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

2 Section 1. Section 32-6-1.2, Code of Alabama 1975,
3 is amended to read as follows:

4 "§32-6-1.2.

5 "(a) The driver's license of a resident of this
6 state who is an honorably discharged veteran as evidenced by
7 the veteran's DD Form 214, or if the veteran does not have a
8 DD Form 214, as evidenced by the veteran's Record and Report
9 of Separation Honorable Discharge Record, upon request of the
10 eligible veteran, shall have the word veteran displayed on the
11 license.

12 "(b) The Department of Public Safety may not impose
13 any charge in addition to the driver's license fee for the
14 issuance or renewal of a veteran's driver's license."

15 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
16 first day of the third month following its passage and
17 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
