ENROLLED, House Joint Resolution,
RECOGNIZING GIRL SCOUT ADVOCACY DAY ON MARCH 13,
2014.

WHEREAS, March 13 is Girl Scout Day at the Alabama
Legislature; and

WHEREAS, Honorary Girl Scout Troop 1912, named for
the year that the Girl Scouts was founded, is a bipartisan
delegation of women and men of the Alabama House of
Representatives and the Alabama Senate established by Girl
Scouts of North-Central Alabama and Girl Scouts of Southern
Alabama to educate our great state's legislative body about
issues affecting girls and young women; and

WHEREAS, for more than 100 years, Girl Scouts has
been engaged in girls' lives and has been a leader and
resource regarding girls' growth and development; and

WHEREAS, through Girl Scouting, girls can develop in
an environment where they build confidence, have opportunities
to try new things, cultivate friendships, connect with their
communities, and obtain the skills they need to become
successful leaders; and

WHEREAS, Girl Scouts is committed to increasing
girls' involvement in science, technology, engineering and
math (STEM); building girls' leadership skills; increasing

1 girls' financial literacy, and promoting safe and healthy
2 living by reducing bullying and relational aggression; and

7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
