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8 CREATING THE BLACKBELT INFRASTRUCTURE LEGISLATIVE 9 COMMITTEE.

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BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Blackbelt Infrastructure Joint Legislative Committee is created. The committee shall be composed of three Senate members, one Senate member to be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor and two Senate members to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Assignments; and three House members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House. These six members shall be voting members of the committee. Four additional nonvoting members shall include a representative of the Alabama Department of Commerce, the Department of Transportation, and the Bureau of Tourism and Travel, each to be appointed by the chief administrative officer of the respective department or agency. The chair and vice chair of the committee shall be elected at the first meeting by the members of the committee. The committee shall meet upon the call of the chair. Meetings and public hearings may be conducted by the committee at any location in the State of Alabama. The committee shall study all facets of
infrastructure needs in the Blackbelt counties of the State;
how best to meet those needs; and the appropriate types of
infrastructure in the Blackbelt to encourage and facilitate
industrial development.

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Upon the request of the chair, the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House shall provide necessary clerical assistance for the work of the committee. The committee shall report its findings, conclusions, and recommendations to the Legislature not later than the 10th legislative day of the 2015 and 2016 Regular Sessions. The committee shall stand dissolved and discharged of any further duties and liabilities after its 2016 reporting. Through the 2014 General Election, each legislative member of the committee shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, his or her per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of the committee. Immediately after the 2014 General Election, members shall receive compensation and expense reimbursement as provided by Amendment 871 to the State Constitution. Compensation and expense allowance shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the use of the Legislature. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no legislative member shall receive additional legislative compensation or per diem when the Legislature is in session or if a legislative member is being paid any other payments on the same dates for attendance of other state business. The total expenditures of the committee shall not exceed five

- thousand dollars (\$5,000) per fiscal year for each fiscal year
- of its existence.
