WHEREAS, he completed Armed Forces Staff College in
 1979, Air War College in 1983, and Industrial College of the
 Armed Forces in 1988; and

4 WHEREAS, he served with honor and distinction in the United States Air Force as a navigator, stationed in many 5 6 locations including Vietnam, where he was shot down during a 7 mission over North Vietnam and became a Prisoner of War on May 23, 1972; upon his release from his POW prison after ten 8 months, he attended Pilot Training School in Texas, flying the 9 10 powerful F-4 Phantom with 358 combat missions and more than 11 3,000 total flying hours; and

12 WHEREAS, Colonel Bean was the recipient of a number of well-deserved medals and decorations, including the Legion 13 14 of Merit, Distinguished Flying Cross, Bronze Star with Valor, 15 Purple Heart with One Oak Leaf Cluster (OLC), Defense Meritorious Service, Meritorious Service Medal with Two OLC, 16 17 Air Medal with 14 OLC, Air Force Outstanding Unit Award with Valor with Four OLC, Air Force Organizational Excellence 18 Award, Prisoner of War Medal, Combat Readiness Medal, National 19 Defense Service Medal with One Bronze Service Star (BSS), 20 21 Vietnam Service Medal with Three BSS, Air Force Overseas Short Tour Ribbon with One OLC, Air Force Longevity Service Award 22 23 with Six OLC, Small Arms Expert Marksmanship Ribbon, Air Force Training Ribbon, Republic of Vietnam Gallantry Cross with 24 25 Palm, and Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal; and

26 WHEREAS, after an exemplary 30-year career that took
27 him all over the globe, his final assignment with the Air

Force brought him and his family to Maxwell Air Force Base,
 Alabama, where he served as the Director of Doctrinal
 Development and Seminar Director, Department of Strategy,
 Doctrine and Air Power, at the Air War College; he later
 retired and joined the Civil Air Patrol, serving as Director
 of Cadet Programs for nine years; and

7 WHEREAS, in retirement, he enjoyed golf, Auburn
8 University football, traveling, fishing, weekly Bible study,
9 and volunteering at the Alabama Department of Archives and
10 History in Montgomery; and

WHEREAS, survivors include his devoted wife of 37 years, Mindy Rodgers Bean; daughter and son-in-law, Peyton and Tyler Turner; granddaughter, Olivia; brothers, Paul, Al, and David; and sister, Cindy; and

WHEREAS, Colonel Bean was a valued member of the community; although his presence will be greatly missed, his memory will be cherished in the hearts of those who were fortunate to know him; and

WHEREAS, Colonel Ray Bean's military service as a decorated navigator and fighter pilot served his nation in the highest tradition of our United States Military, and he will be honored by internment in Arlington National Cemetery on April 9, 2014; now therefore,
