1 ran down to the car to assist; as he was helping this person, 2 he heard someone else screaming for help from inside the car and after pulling the first victim to safety, he quickly 3 4 returned to help the second victim, who was trapped inside the 5 car and unable to escape on his own; seeing that the flames 6 were quickly spreading, Officer Green grasped the victim by 7 his upper body and pulled him from the car to safety as the car was completely engulfed in flames; and 8

WHEREAS, Captain Edwin "Brad" Appleton of the Center 9 10 Point Fire District wrote the following to Officer Green's supervisor: "...a vehicle struck a guard rail and left the 11 12 roadway. The vehicle caught fire with two males inside. An off-duty BPD officer, Officer Green, pulled both the driver 13 14 and passenger from the vehicle and led them to safety. If not for the actions of Officer Green, the driver and passenger 15 both would likely have become fatalities."; and 16

WHEREAS, without hesitation and with great risk to himself, Officer Green rushed to the aid of two persons, who very possibly would have died if not for his heroic actions; and

21 WHEREAS, Officer Green's dedicated service 22 contributes greatly to the safety and quality of life of the 23 citizens of Birmingham, and he is truly deserving of this 24 distinguished nomination for the Legislative Medal of Honor 25 for Law Enforcement; now therefore,

HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we hereby recognize and honor

Officer Mark Green of the Birmingham Police Department as a
