8 trailblazer at Camp Courage in October 2013 at Ivy Green, the
9 historic birthplace of Helen Keller, in Tuscumbia, Alabama;

12 sixth-grader at L.E. Wilson School in Sheffield, Alabama,
13 where he is an exceptional student whose ambition is to be
14 involved in producing movies; he was selected to be a member

17 arts and crafts, music, drama, field trips, and discussions;

23 WHEREAS, Camp Courage is an intensive, broad-based,
24 three-day program for visually impaired and hearing impaired
25 children between the ages of 7 and 14; the camp is sponsored

1 by the Helen Keller Birthplace Foundation and the American
2 Optometric Association Foundation, in conjunction with the
3 University of North Alabama and the University of Alabama at
4 Birmingham; and

5 WHEREAS, at a young age, Cody Steward has earned
6 respect for his diligent pursuit of excellence, and he is
7 truly deserving of special recognition; now therefore,

8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
