9	RESEARCH ENHANCEMENT ACT AND INCREASE FEDERAL FUNDING FOR
10	PULMONARY FIBROSIS RESEARCH AND COMMENDING BILL CONNELLEY.
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12	WHEREAS, a total of 40,000 United States citizens
13	lose their lives to Pulmonary Fibrosis, annually, yet a
14	federally funded national awareness or education effort that
15	would enhance understanding of the fatal disease in the public
16	and medical communities is nonexistent; and
17	WHEREAS, Pulmonary Fibrosis, a relentless and
18	progressive disease, which is marked by scarring of the lungs
19	and ultimately inhibits a person's ability to breathe, causes
20	the same amount of deaths as Breast Cancer; and
21	WHEREAS, currently, 48,000 United States citizens
22	are diagnosed with Pulmonary Fibrosis annually, and more than
23	200,000 United States citizens could possibly be living with
24	the debilitating disease; notably, cases of Pulmonary
25	Fibrosis, which have increased more than 150 percent since
26	2001, are expected to continue rising; and

1 WHEREAS, the public's awareness of Pulmonary 2 Fibrosis remains low despite its widespread prevalence; shockingly, the public is more aware of less prevalent 3 4 diseases than Pulmonary Fibrosis; and WHEREAS, federal funding for Pulmonary Fibrosis 5 6 research is imperative to fully comprehend the cause of 7 Pulmonary Fibrosis, which at the present time, is not well-understood and is unknown in the majority of cases; 8 growing evidence supports that environmental or occupational 9 10 exposure to pollutants is potentially a cause; and WHEREAS, a Food and Drug Administration-approved 11 12 treatment or cure for Pulmonary Fibrosis is not available, and the median survival rate for a patient affected by Pulmonary 13 14 Fibrosis is 2.8 years; and 15 WHEREAS, the Pulmonary Fibrosis Research Enhancement Act, the first-ever legislation for Pulmonary Fibrosis 16 17 research funding, would dramatically assist efforts to help improve the quality of lives of those affected by Pulmonary 18 Fibrosis and save lives; and 19 WHEREAS, celebrities who have helped bring this 20 21 disease to light include Tom Brokaw and Jay Leno, among 22 others; Jerry Lewis is presently living with the disease, and 23 Marlon Brando, Peter Benchley, and Evel Knievel are just a few well-known figures who have passed away with the disease; and 24 25 WHEREAS, Bill Connelley of Montgomery, Alabama, has 26 not only valiantly engaged in a battle to overcome his Pulmonary Fibrosis diagnosis, but has encouraged and helped 27

others with the disease; he, along with his family, friends, and neighbors have rallied to raise awareness of Pulmonary Fibrosis, and their magnanimous efforts are highly honored and commended; and

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we hereby commend Bill Connelley and his family and friends for their outstanding efforts to raise public awareness of the issue, and we urge Congress to enact the Pulmonary Fibrosis Research Act and increase federal funding for Pulmonary Fibrosis Research. The support of Congress for this ground-breaking initiative would transform and preserve lives.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to Bill Connelley and to each member of the Alabama Congressional Delegation and to the President of the United States for their immediate consideration and implementation.
