8 COMMENDING BRANDON WOMACK OF SCOTTSBORO ON WINNING
9 HIS SIXTH STATE WRESTLING CHAMPIONSHIP.

11 WHEREAS, it is with highest commendation that
12 Brandon Womack of Scottsboro is recognized on winning his
13 sixth State Championship at the 2014 AHSAA Wrestling
14 Championships in Huntsville, Alabama; and

15 WHEREAS, Brandon Womack is the most celebrated
16 wrestler in the history of the sport in Alabama; he has a
17 career total of 422 wins and only eight losses, and he owns
18 State and National Records for both Career Wins and Career
19 Wins via pin (327); and

20 WHEREAS, Brandon Womack has won 37 Career Tournament
21 Championships and holds the distinction of being a five-time
22 winner of the Class 5A Most Outstanding Wrestler Award; and

23 WHEREAS, Brandon Womack won his first State Title,
24 the 5A 103-Pound Weight Class, as a seventh-grader, repeated
25 the victory the following year, then won the 112-Pound Weight
26 Class as a freshman and the 126-Pound Weight Class as a

1 sophomore; his junior and senior year State Championships both
2 came in the 160-Pound Weight Class; and

3 WHEREAS, Brandon Womack finished his final season at
4 Scottsboro High School with a 77-0 record, the most wins ever
5 by an Alabama wrestler during a perfect season; and

6 WHEREAS, Brandon Womack's is one of only two
7 wrestlers in the State of Alabama to win six State
8 Championships; and

9 WHEREAS, the athletic accomplishments of Brandon
10 Womack are the source of justifiable pride to his family, his
11 school, and the entire community, and he is truly deserving of
12 special recognition for his diligent commitment to the pursuit
13 of excellence; now there,

14 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF
15 THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That Brandon Womack of Scottsboro
16 is hereby most highly honored and commended, and this
17 resolution is offered with heartiest congratulations on
18 winning his Sixth State Wrestling Championship, along with
19 best wishes for continuing success in future endeavors.
