10	WHEREAS, we note the death of Joseph C. Moquin of
11	Madison, Alabama, on March 16, 2014, with deep sadness; his
12	immeasurable life of 89 years is commended and celebrated with
13	great thanksgiving; and
14	WHEREAS, the passing of Mr. Moquin leaves a void in
15	the lives of his loving family, many friends, and the entire
16	community, where he was highly regarded; and
17	WHEREAS, Mr. Moquin is a native of Middleboro,
18	Massachusetts, and he served with much honor and distinction
19	in World War II as a captain in the Army Corps of Engineers;
20	he received his Bachelor of Science Degree in Industrial
21	Engineering at Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri,
22	and embarked upon his distinguished career as Director of the
23	Army Ordinance Management Engineering Program at Rock Island
24	in 1952; and
25	WHEREAS, notably, he served as chief management
26	engineer for the then Army Ballistic Missile Agency,
27	contributing his expert guidance and leadership to the pivotal

1 launch of our country's first satellite, Explorer; in 2 addition, he served Teledyne Brown as Executive President, President, and as Chairman of the Board; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Mr. Moquin served as Executive Vice President of Brown Engineering, which flourished under his 5 6 leadership and later merged with Teledyne, Inc., to become 7 Teledyne Brown Engineering; he was very influential in the establishment of Cummings Research Park; many paid tribute to 8 him when he retired as Chairman of TBE; on the occasion, 700 9 10 people gathered at the Von Braun Civic Center to pay their respect, he received a telegram from President Bush, and flags 11 12 were flown aboard the space Shuttle; a street in Cummings 13 Research Park was named after him; and 14 WHEREAS, upon retirement from TBE, he served as 15 interim President of The University of Alabama in Huntsville and interim director of the Space and Rocket Center; he served 16 17 for a number of years on the boards of Alabama AandM University, Alabama Heritage Trust Fund, UAH Foundation, UAB 18 Board of Directors, NASA's Advisory Council, Huntsville 19 20 Madison County Chamber of Commerce and Harris Home for 21 Children; and 22 WHEREAS, Mr. Moquin has received accolades including 23 Army's Outstanding Civilian Service Medal, Huntsville's 24 Distinguished Service Award, the Medaris Award from the local 25 chapter of the American Defense Preparedness Association,

Ordnance Corps Hall of Fame, and an honorary Doctor of Science from UAH in 1983; and
