8 MOURNING THE DEATH OF JOSEPH C. MOQUIN.

10 WHEREAS, we note the death of Joseph C. Moquin of
11 Madison, Alabama, on March 16, 2014, with deep sadness; his
12 immeasurable life of 89 years is commended and celebrated with
13 great thanksgiving; and

14 WHEREAS, the passing of Mr. Moquin leaves a void in
15 the lives of his loving family, many friends, and the entire
16 community, where he was highly regarded; and

17 WHEREAS, Mr. Moquin is a native of Middleboro,
18 Massachusetts, and he served with much honor and distinction
19 in World War II as a captain in the Army Corps of Engineers;
20 he received his Bachelor of Science Degree in Industrial
21 Engineering at Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri,
22 and embarked upon his distinguished career as Director of the
23 Army Ordinance Management Engineering Program at Rock Island
24 in 1952; and

25 WHEREAS, notably, he served as chief management
26 engineer for the then Army Ballistic Missile Agency,
27 contributing his expert guidance and leadership to the pivotal

1 launch of our country's first satellite, Explorer; in
2 addition, he served Teledyne Brown as Executive President,
3 President, and as Chairman of the Board; and

4 WHEREAS, Mr. Moquin served as Executive Vice
5 President of Brown Engineering, which flourished under his
6 leadership and later merged with Teledyne, Inc., to become
7 Teledyne Brown Engineering; he was very influential in the
8 establishment of Cummings Research Park; many paid tribute to
9 him when he retired as Chairman of TBE; on the occasion, 700
10 people gathered at the Von Braun Civic Center to pay their
11 respect, he received a telegram from President Bush, and flags
12 were flown aboard the space Shuttle; a street in Cummings
13 Research Park was named after him; and

14 WHEREAS, upon retirement from TBE, he served as
15 interim President of The University of Alabama in Huntsville
16 and interim director of the Space and Rocket Center; he served
17 for a number of years on the boards of Alabama AandM
18 University, Alabama Heritage Trust Fund, UAH Foundation, UAB
19 Board of Directors, NASA's Advisory Council, Huntsville
20 Madison County Chamber of Commerce and Harris Home for
21 Children; and

22 WHEREAS, Mr. Moquin has received accolades including
23 Army's Outstanding Civilian Service Medal, Huntsville's
24 Distinguished Service Award, the Medaris Award from the local
25 chapter of the American Defense Preparedness Association,
26 induction into the Alabama Engineering Hall of Fame and the

1 Ordnance Corps Hall of Fame, and an honorary Doctor of Science
2 from UAH in 1983; and

3 WHEREAS, survivors include his beloved and devoted
4 wife of 35 years, Anita J. Moquin; sons, Michael, Steve, Clay,
5 Bill, Paul, and Tom; two daughters, Meg Hereford and Sarah Jo
6 Chadwell; two step-children, John Higgins and Suzanne
7 Carlisle; nine grandchildren; brother, Walter Moquin; and
8 sister, Mary Scotese; and

9 WHEREAS, through the years, he has earned immense
10 respect for his tireless dedication and exceptional abilities,
11 and his numerous contributions reflect immense credit upon the
12 entire State of Alabama; and

13 WHEREAS, Mr. Moquin is a valued member of the
14 community; although his presence is greatly missed, his memory
15 is cherished in the hearts and minds of all those who were
16 fortunate enough to know him; now therefore,

17 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF
18 THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That while grieving the death of
19 Joseph C. Moquin, we are highly grateful for his abundant
20 life, and we offer this resolution in highest tribute to his
21 profound legacy, as well as in heartfelt sympathy to his
22 family and friends.
