WHEREAS, Mr. Tarver received his Master's Degree 5 6 from Alabama A and M University and his AA Certificate from 7 The University of Alabama at Birmingham; he pursued extensive study in science sponsored by the National Science Foundation 8 at a number of universities including Ohio Wesleyan, Oregon 9 10 State, North Carolina A and T, and Tuskegee University; for a number of years, he taught in the Veteran's School of 11 Birmingham until it closed, and the Birmingham Public School 12 13 System at Parker, Carver, and Ensley High Schools as a science 14 teacher until his retirement; he also served as a licensed 15 agent for securities and life and health insurance; and

WHEREAS, he performed community service with Boy 16 17 Scouts of America as an Exploring Advisor and as a Life Member of Alpha Phi Alpha, Fraternity, Inc., and he was an avid 18 supporter of Miles College through its Alumni Association and 19 especially its Boosters; he was inducted into the Miles 20 21 College Sports Hall of Fame in 1981, selected as a Co-Alumni 22 Association Honoree in 2009, and was selected as Birmingham 23 Chapter and Co-Booster of the Year in 2013; and
