8 SYNOPSIS: This bill would prohibit a recipient of
9 public assistance benefits from using the benefits
10 to purchase any alcoholic beverage, tobacco
11 product, or lottery ticket and would provide

This bill would prohibit a person or a business entity from knowingly accepting public assistance benefits held on electronic benefit transfer cards for the purchase of any alcoholic beverage or tobacco product and would include civil fines and other penalties for violations.

This bill would prohibit a recipient of public assistance benefits from withdrawing or using public assistance benefits in a retail establishment that primarily sells alcoholic beverages, a casino, a tattoo or body piercing facility, a facility providing psychic services, or an establishment that provides adult-oriented entertainment in which performers disrobe or

perform in an unclothed state and provides

penalties for violations, including the suspension

of benefits.

This bill would allow a parent of a minor child who is permanently disqualified from receiving public assistance benefits to designate a third party to receive the benefits for the benefit of the minor child.

This bill would create the Public Assistance Integrity Fund for the deposit of all civil fines collected pursuant to the act for use by the Department of Human Resources and the Attorney General for costs associated with the prevention of misuse of public assistance benefits, including, but not limited to, administration, oversight, training, and enforcement related activities.

This bill would require the Department of
Human Resources to consult with providers of
automatic teller machine (ATM) services to consider
the implementation of a program or method of
blocking access to cash benefits from Electronic
Benefits Transfer cards issued by the department at
automatic teller machines located in such
establishments and to initiate a program if
feasible.

This bill would also require the department to perform monthly incarceration matches to assist

in determining eligibility based on incarceration and to perform a monthly match using the United States Social Security Death Index Database to determine if a recipient of public assistance benefits is deceased.

Relating to public assistance benefits; to prohibit a recipient of public assistance from using benefits to purchase any alcoholic beverage, tobacco product, or lottery ticket; to prohibit a person or a business entity from accepting public assistance benefits held on electronic benefit transfer cards for the purchase of any alcoholic beverage or tobacco product; to prohibit a recipient of public assistance benefits from withdrawing or using public assistance benefits in a retail establishment that primarily sells alcoholic beverages, a casino, a tattoo or body piercing facility, a facility providing psychic services, or an establishment that provides adult-oriented entertainment in which performers disrobe or perform in an unclothed state; to provide penalties for violations; to allow a parent of a minor child who is disqualified from receiving benefits to designate a third party to receive the benefits for the benefit of the minor child; to require the Department of Human Resources to

notify applicants and recipients of public assistance of the restrictions and penalties for violations; to create the Public Assistance Integrity Fund; to require the Department of Human Resources to consult with providers of automatic teller machine services to consider and implement a program or method of blocking access to cash benefits from Electronic Benefits Transfer cards issued by the department at automatic teller machines located in certain establishments if feasible; to provide rulemaking authority to the department; and to require the department to perform monthly matches to determine eligibility based upon incarceration and whether the recipient is deceased.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this section, the term "public assistance benefits" means money or property provided directly or indirectly to eligible persons through programs of the federal government, the state, or any political subdivision thereof, and administered by the Alabama Department of Human Resources.

- (b) (1) A recipient of public assistance benefits may not use any portion of the benefits for the purchase of any alcoholic beverage, tobacco product, or lottery ticket. Any person who violates this subsection shall reimburse the Department of Human Resources for the purchase and shall be subject to the following sanctions:
- a. Upon the first violation, the person shall be disqualified from receiving public assistance benefits by

means of direct cash payment or an electronic benefits
transfer access card for one month.

- b. Upon the second violation, the person shall be disqualified from receiving public assistance benefits by means of direct cash payment or electronic benefits transfer access card for three months.
  - c. Upon a third or subsequent violation, the person shall be permanently disqualified from receiving public assistance benefits by means of direct cash payment or an electronic benefits transfer access card.
  - (2) A person who is disqualified from receiving public assistance benefits under this subsection shall have the right to a hearing pursuant to the Alabama Administrative Procedure Act.
  - (c) A person or business entity, or any agent or employee thereof, may not knowlingly accept public assistance benefits held on an electronic benefit transfer card for the purchase of any alcoholic beverage or tobacco product. Any person or business entity who violates this subsection shall be subject to the following civil penalties:
  - (1) One hundred dollars (\$100) for the first violation.
    - (2) Five hundred dollars (\$500) for the second violation within five years.
  - (3) One thousand dollars (\$1,000) for a third or a subsequent violation within five years and the Attorney

General may bring an action to suspend the business licenses and permits of the person or business entity for one year.

- (d) (1) A cash recipient of public assistance benefits may not withdraw or use cash benefits by means of an Electronic Benefits Transfer transaction for the purchase of goods or services in a retail establishment the primary purchase of which is the sale of alcoholic beverages, a casino, a tattoo or body piercing facility, a facility providing psychic services, or an establishment that provides adult-oriented entertainment in which performers disrobe or perform in an unclothed state. Any person who violates this subsection shall reimburse the Department of Human Resources for the amount withdrawn and used and shall be subject to the following sanctions:
- a. Upon the first violation, the person shall be disqualified from receiving public assistance benefits by means of direct cash payment or an electronic benefits transfer access card for a period of one month.
- b. Upon the second violation, the person shall be disqualified from receiving public assistance benefits by means of direct cash payment or electronic benefits transfer access card for a period of three months.
- c. Upon a third or subsequent violation, the person shall be permanently disqualified from receiving public assistance benefits by means of direct cash payment or an electronic benefits transfer access card.

(2) A person who is disqualified from receiving public assistance benefits under this subsection shall have the right to a hearing pursuant to the Alabama Administrative Procedure Act.

- (e) If a parent is deemed permanently disqualified from receiving public assistance benefits under subsection (b) or (d), the dependent child or other adult family member's eligibility for public assistance benefits is not affected.
- (1) An appropriate protective payee shall be designated to receive benefits on behalf of the child members.
- (2) The parent may choose to designate another person to receive benefits for the minor child members. The designated person must be an immediate family member or, if an immediate family member is not available or the family member declines the option, another person may be designated. The designated person must be approved by the department.
- (f) The Department of Human Resources shall inform all applicants for and recipients of public assistance benefits of the restrictions contained in this section and the penalties for violating those restrictions through any means practical.
- (g) (1) The Department of Human Resources shall consult with providers of automatic teller machine services to consider the implementation of a program or method of blocking access to cash benefits from an electronic benefits transfer access card issued by the department at automatic teller machines located in or at a retail establishment the primary

- purchase of which is the sale of alcoholic beverages, a

Section 2. There is created within the State

Treasury a fund to be known and designated as the Public

Assistance Integrity Fund. All civil fines collected pursuant
to subsection (c) of Section 1 shall be deposited into the
fund for use by the Department of Human Resources and the

Attorney General for costs associated with the prevention of
misuse of public assistance benefits, including, but not
limited to, administration, oversight, training, and
enforcement related activities.

Section 3. (a) For the purposes of this section, the term "public assistance benefits" means money or property provided directly or indirectly to eligible persons through programs of the federal government, the state, or any political subdivision thereof, and administered by the Alabama Department of Human Resources.

(b) (1) The Alabama Department of Human Resources shall perform a monthly incarceration match to obtain information to assist in determining eligibility for public assistance benefits based on incarceration status.

- (2) If the department determines that a recipient of public assistance benefits is incarcerated at the time the incarceration match is performed, the department shall not issue an electronic benefits transfer access card to the incarcerated recipient. If an electronic benefits transfer access card has already been issued to the incarcerated recipient, the department shall deactivate the card.
- (c) The department shall perform a monthly match using the United States Social Security Death Index Database to determine if a recipient is deceased. If the department determines that the recipient is deceased at the time the index match is performed, the department shall not issue an electronic benefits transfer access card. If an electronic benefits transfer access card has already been issued to the deceased recipient, the department shall deactivate the card.

Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
