25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
26	Section 1. (a) The Alabama Emergency Management
27	Agency may offer directly to any local emergency management

agency of this state any used or obsolete equipment, supplies, or material through sale, gift, grant, or loan to be utilized for purposes of emergency management. Neither the Alabama Emergency Management Agency nor its director, officers, and employees shall be liable for any civil damages for personal injury, property damage, or death resulting from a defect in the equipment sold, loaned, donated, or otherwise made available to the local emergency management agency pursuant to this section.

(b) Unless specifically provided otherwise at the time of the sale, gift, grant, or loan, any local emergency management agency receiving property from the Alabama Emergency Management Agency through sale, gift, or grant may dispose of such property as determined appropriate by the local governing body overseeing the local emergency management agency. Any property loaned to the local emergency management agency shall be returned to the Alabama Emergency Management Agency as directed by the Alabama Emergency Management Agency.

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
