- Section 1. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, the local judge of probate or other county license plate issuing official authorized to issue motor vehicle licenses or registrations may offer an optional two-year license and registration for motor vehicles operated on the public
 - (b) If a registrant elects to register his or her motor vehicle for a two-year period, he or she shall do all of the following:
 - (1) Pay the local issuance fee. The registrant shall not be required to pay an additional local issuance fee for the second year of registration.
 - (2) Pay the license taxes and registration fees for each year at the time of the election to renew the registration for two years.
 - (3) Pay ad valorem taxes as follows at the time of the election to renew the registration for two years:
 - a. For the first year of registration, pay the ad valorem tax as provided by law.
- b. For the second year of registration, pay the ad valorem tax assessed under paragraph a., less 10 percent of the total tax assessed.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
