3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) As used in this section, electronic citation means the process of transmitting traffic, misdemeanor, municipal ordinance, conservation, or other citations and law enforcement data via electronic means to a court clerk.

- (b) To defray the expense of establishing and maintaining electronic citations, the court clerk in the circuit, district, or municipal court shall charge and collect an electronic citation fee as court costs in any traffic, misdemeanor, municipal ordinance, or conservation case. This fee shall be in addition to all other court costs and shall be disbursed as provided in this section. Sixty percent of the fee shall be retained by the court clerk collecting the fee and 40 percent of the fee shall be disbursed to the state, county, or municipal fund funding the arresting law enforcement agency. All of the proceeds shall be used solely to defray expenses related to the establishment and maintenance of electronic citations.
- (c) The court clerk shall not charge and collect an electronic citation fee if the county commission or municipal governing body by ordinance elects not to be subject to this section.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
